KIEV/MOSCOW: Russia is seeking a "short truce" - a proposal Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy vehemently dismissed as it would allow Moscow's forces to regain strength after suffering a series of battlefield defeats. Officials in Russia have repeatedly said they were ready to engage in peace talks without any conditions, but it is not clear if they have made a formal ceasefire offer as mentioned by Zelenskyy on Friday.

- Ukraine could capture Russia's region of Crimea by the end of this year, the Kiev's deputy defense minister, Vladimir Gavrilov, has said. In an interview with Sky News on Saturday, Gavrilov stated that what is known as a 'black swan' or a sudden and unexpected event - could bring about victory. "I

think Russia can face a black swan in their country, inside Russia, and this can contribute to [our] success with Crimea," he said, adding that there was "also a military option as well with some kind of combination of forces, resources and something else." "We can step into Crimea, for example, by the end of December.

coming months, Gavrilov suggested that Russian President Vladimir Putin could "disappear, for example, due to some reason, physical and political," or that the Russian public could become "disillusioned" with the situation on the battlefield.

- Poland's decision to ban Moscow's top diplomat, Sergey Lavrov, from attending a ministerial meeting of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) in Lodz next month is unacceptable and provocative, the Russian Foreign Ministry said on Saturday. The statement came the day after Warsaw confirmed that it would deny entry to EU-sanctioned Russian officials, including Lavrov.

- British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak made an unannounced visit to the Kyiv, Ukraine where he met with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. Sunak reaffirmed the U.K.'s continued support for Ukraine, which has received nearly \$3 billion in military aid from Britain. *AGENCIES*

It was his first electoral defeat in more than half a century.

US to help Thailand develop small nuclear reactors

BANGKOK: The United States will help Thailand develop nuclear power through a new class of small reactors, part of a programme aimed at fighting climate change, Vice President Kamala Harris announced on a visit Saturday. The White House said the assistance was part of its Net Zero World Initiative, a project launched at last year's Glasgow cli-States partners with the private sector and philanthropists to promote clean energy. Thailand does not have nuclear power, with the public mood on the issue souring after the 2011 Fukushima disaster in Japan. The White House said it would offer technical assistance to the Southeast Asian country to deploy the developing technology of small modular reactors, which are factory-built and portable. Such reactors are generally considered safer as they do not need human intervention to shut down in emergencies. A White House statework with Thailand on deploying the

Blue Diamond Affair: Saudi Thai diplomatic ties restored after three decades

Bangkok: Thailand's Prime Minister met with Saudi Crown Prince, Mohammed bin Salman, on Friday in Bangkok, signing agreements to expand diplomatic relations restored this year, more than three decades after Saudi Arabia downgraded ties over a jewelry theft. The two leaders presided over the signing of five agreements, pledging to increase trade and investment between the two countries, promote tourism and deepen cooperation in energy. Thailand is hoping that its improving relationship with Saudi Arabia could give it an economic boost. Prime Minister, Prayuth Chan-ocha held bilateral talks with the Crown Prince on the sidelines of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation over the theft of around \$20 million



(APEC) summit in Bangkok. Saudi Arabia was invited as a guest of the APEC host country. The two countries restored full diplomatic ties in January when Prayuth visited the country at the invitation of the Crown Prince. Saudi Arabia downgraded diplomatic relations in 1989, following a row

of jewels by a Thai janitor working in the palace of a Saudi Prince, in what became known as the "Blue Diamond Affair". A large number of the gems, including a rare blue diamond, were never recovered. The theft remains an unsolved mystery and was followed by the execution-style murder in Thailand of three Saudi diplomats. "The restoration of ties has mutual benefits for both countries," the Crown Prince said, adding that investment, infrastructure and public health were important areas.

"Overcoming the Blue Diamond issue is a net positive for both countries," said Ben Kiatkwankul, partner at government affairs advisory, Maverick Consulting Group. *AGENCIES*

Twitter offices shut and employee access suspended

Twitter told its employees on Thursday that all office buildings will be temporarily closed and that badge access will be suspended, media reports say. According to an internal message seen by the BBC, workers were told the offices would reopen next Monday, although the company gave no reason for the closure. The message also asked workers to "continue to comply with company policy by refraining from discussing confidential company information on social media, with the press or elsewhere." Some suspect the move may be attributable to fears held by Elon Musk and his team that disgruntled employees may attempt to sabotage the company from within, according to Platformer managing editor Zoe Schiffer. The announcement comes amid growing tension in Twitter since Musk began making drastic changes to the company's operations, including laying off over 50% of the work-



force. Several hundred employees also resigned from Twitter after the billionaire allegedly told staff that they should prepare for "difficult times ahead," be ready to commit to longer working hours and be "extremely hardcore." According to the Washington Post, the memo added that those who refuse to sign up for these conditions would be terminated with three months of severance pay. Meanwhile, Musk tweeted that Twitter had hit "another all-time high" in traffic to the site. He dismissed concerns over the massive layoffs and resignations, stating that "the best people are staying." (APP)

CM KP Mahmood Khan calls for early election

PESHWAR: Chief Minister Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Mahmood Khan has said that the only way to steer the country out of political and economic crises is to immediately hold free and fair elections. The economy cannot prosper as long as the conglomerate of political goons stays in power and the miseries of ordinary citizens caused by inflation will further escalate. The only reason for placing corrupt politicians in power is to loot the national wealth and weaken the accountability mechanism. In a statement issued from the Chief Minister's Secretariat here on Saturday, Mahmood Khan said that, under the leadership of PTI Chairman Imran Khan, the country will be freed from the clutches of imported rulers because they have brought the national economy to the brink of collapse. The imported government has damaged the national interest for their personal gains and benefits. 



This winter, Pakistan is experiencing matter, is misdirected and will do its sixth season of intense smog. Lahore, in particular, consistently takes top spot in the list of most polluted cities in the world, a position it continues to hold with AQI which has already topped 400. Residents of Karachi, Gujranwala, and Islamabad are also breathing in toxic air, while other parts of Pakistan are equally exposed to hazardous levels of air pollutants. Our officials, on the other hand, sound like a broken record by blaming India year after year for cross-border pollution. While that might explain part of the problem, it is certainly not the main cause, and any attempts to outsource responsibility is nothing but populist rhetoric. It is time we collectively understand the causes of air pollution, learn from countries that have successfully tackled it, and implement similar measures at home. Creating anti-smog task forces, closing down schools and offices during high smog days, and taking punitive action against farmers burning crops are band-aid measures that look impactful on television, but do little to save us from poisonous air come winter months. The Global Alliance on Health and Pollution found that 128,000 Pakistanis die of air-pollution related illnesses every year. This includes asthma, lung damage, bronchial infections, strokes, heart problems and shortened life expectancy. An entire generation of kids who breathe and play in toxic air risk growing up with irredeemable adverse health effects. The issue is critical, and reforms had to be taken vesterday. But there is no high-level debate or a targeted approach to that effect. Instead, the entire country is focused on climate reparations from developed countries. It is true that Pakistan needs to be fairly compensated by countries that bear direct responsibility for climate change-related extreme weather events. But it must be emphasized that air pollution is primarily an anthropogenic home-grown phenomenon. Blaming

nothing to improve the situation in Pakistan. Smog is caused by human activities such as vehicular emissions, industrial pollution, fossil-fuel fired power plants and burning of waste material. It is compounded by a high population density and the rapid decline of tree cover due to expansion of roads, and construction of underpasses. Our power plan for the next ten years talks little of renewable energy sources such as wind and solar. Emphasis, instead, is placed on cost saving measures such as indigenous sources of coal for power generation. Extraction from Thar's coal mines has picked up pace and new industries and power plants will soon be set up there. Responsibility for environmental protection was devolved to the provinces in 2011 but the existing laws are weak. and enforcement is poor. Despite the blame game with India, there is a lack of cross-border air quality data. Poor urban planning and a dearth of reformist vision is part of the poor social attitude that ensures we remain stuck in the smog-alarm-rainforget cycle every year. To make any meaningful change, we must learn from countries that have successfully implemented reforms. Japan, for example, serves as a good model. In the latter half of the 20th century, Japan experienced worsening air pollution due to rapid economic growth and industrial activity, and the resultant build-up of soot, dust, and nitrous and sulphur oxides. To tackle this, Japan empowered local governments and passed laws such as the Municipal Environmental Protection Ordinance of Tokyo. Constitutional changes in air pollution control laws allowed the country to regulate industrial smoke emissions. Japan also overhauled their transportation policy through the passage of the Diesel Vehicle Regulations and the Automobile NOx PM Law which set a maximum permitted level of vehicle exhaust.

North Korea's ambitions

intercontinental ballistic missile with enough range to hit the US mainland. The missile landed in the sea roughly 210KM west of Hokkaido (Japan). Ostensibly as a gesture of its routine bullying tactics, Pyongyang has deliberately launched this ICBM on the heels of the G20 summit where US President Biden asked Chinese President Xi-Jinping to use his influence on Kim Jong Un to halt his ongoing missile testing flights that have been threatening regional stability. These words, apparently quite austere, do not come as a surprise when viewed against the unabating barrage of missile testing being conducted by Pyongyang since the start of last month. Similarly, on November 13, in Phnom Penh, President Biden, held a session with South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, on the sidelines of the East Asia Summit, quite candidly talked about the threats to the regional stability emanating from the DPRK's incessant belligerency. Though no official response from the Chinese officials was made on President Biden's persistence with President Xi on the question of North Korea's aggressive plans, given the fact that Beijing is uncomfortable with the usage of the reckless rhetoric by Russia on the same subject, it is expected that President Xi may reconsider its role in softening the Pyongyang's rigidity-perhaps a kind of bargaining ploy to win some mollification in the American stance on Taiwan Strait and technology war. President Biden has recently intensified diplomatic efforts to put indirect pressure on Kim Jong Un through President Xi Jinping to bridle his ambitious nuclear and missile programme. There are reasons to believe that Beijing, which has already changed its tone towards Russia's invasion of

North Korea has again launched an Ukraine, is rethinking and reevaluating its full-fledged support to Pyongyang and may shift to a lower gear. In 2017, when Kim Jong Un ordered the detonation of the sixth nuclear test, just a month ahead of the start of the inauguration session of the National Congress of the Chinese Party, it was not liked by President Xi Jinping because of its awkward timing that overshadowed the most important gathering of China's political elite. Again, this time the DPRK started its new spate of aggressive missile testing in the first week of October, almost 13 days ahead of the inauguration of the 20th National Congress in Beijing. It pushed the panic buttons in the region with the spectre of the seventh nuclear test at this crucial time when two major events were around the corner: a session of the Chinese National Congress and the US midterm polls. It was expected that Kim Jong Un, a very moody and impulsive dictator, may set the date of the expected seventh nuclear event in the narrow window between the two events to attract global attention. But it did not happen. One reason could be the indirect pressure from President Xi Jinping. who would have been immensely upset by any misadventure from Kim Jon Un to distract the attention from the most important session of the National Congress where his tenure was extended for the third term. The current spate of weapons tests by Pyongyang, some of which flew over the territories of Japan and South Korea—including an intercontinental ballistic missile—has intensified the speculations about the seventh nuclear test in the coming days. North Korea has long been banned from conducting nuclear tests and ballistic missile launches by the UN Security Council, which strengthened sanctions on Pyongyang over the years to try and cut off funding for those

programmes. Although North Korea, a close ally of China, claims that tests are in response to the largest-ever military drills between the United States and South Korea, which ended early this month, the fact is that North Korea's missile testing is much beyond a "protest reaction". Over the years, due to unhindered and full-fledged support from Beijing, North Korea has developed an increasing sense of impunity, which is witnessed by Pyongyang's deliberate attempts to escalate tension in the Peninsula. It is also a fact that Beijing has an integral role to play in encouraging North Korean restraint and incentivising denuclearisation. The Xi-Biden meeting, despite no formal or informal understanding, still has weightage that will certainly affect the overall atmosphere in the Korean Peninsula. After strengthening his position in the domestic political structure after the 20th National Congress last month, President Xi Jinping is starting a new phase of his political career at home as well as in the international arena. He will be more active in international politics to outcompete the residents of the White House. But he needs an image overhaul to be more acceptable to the outer world. This is only possible when President Xi shows some change in stance over major contentious issues.

The last six months have seen drastic changes in the global scenario, and particularly rendered Russia and North Korea to be downgraded as strategic allies for Beijing. Now, President Xi is in a position to show some compromise on Ukraine's invasion and the DPRK's nuclear programme to find some common grounds to work together with the

Digital Banking — By Mahnoor Sheikh

Pakistan has long been struggling with providing an affordable and user-friendly banking experience to its huge population of 220 million. From simply opening a bank account to carrying out day-to-day financial transactions, dealing with the banking sector in Pakistan is as painstaking as it can be. While the central bank, commercial banks, microfinance banks and growing Fintech companies are trying to ease the woes of the customers by improving the access to financial services, they still struggle with completely unlocking the untapped potential of digital transformation in the country. Not to mention that not a single traditional domestic bank has developed an end-to-end digital operation. Pakistan is home to more than 50 per cent of the world's unbanked population, also reflected in the Global Findex 2021 - Pakistan's financial inclusion rate remains stagnated at 21% between 2017 and 2021, lagging far behind regionally and globally. Over the years, the government and private entities have made substantial efforts to address this challenge with the central bank facilitating the process. The journey towards digital banking particularly began with the State Bank of Pakistan's (SBP) Branchless Banking Regulatory Framework promulgated in 2008 and revised in 2011 and 2016 respectively. In a big leap forward, the

digital banking licenses to promote financial inclusion in the country. In the first phase, the SBP has received 20 applications for Digital Retail Bank (DRB) and Digital Full Bank (DFB) under its Licensing and Regulatory Framework for Digital Banks, and is currently conducting due diligence and evaluating the technical expertise, financial strength, technological infrastructure and risk management frameworks of these applicants. Given the country headlines, a limited number of Global Digital Banks have participated in the application process. The forthcoming digital banking regime is expected to revolutionise the banking services for the unbanked people in remote areas and also for micro, small and medium-sized businesses. Digitalising the SME segment prior to raising banking penetration in the individuthis sector remains out of Pakistan's tax system and generally operates on a cash basis. Among the primary applicants for the digital banking license are the traditional domestic commercial banks, telecommunication and Fintech companies which are already leveraging their huge consumer base in digital financial services. Despite the strengths of traditional banks and Telcos, users often complain about their services, with persisting controversies around data leaks and unauthorised transactions. Not only this, the User Inter- Courtesy Daily Times

face and User Experience of some of the banking applications often raise questions about their functionality, reliability and usability as the digital platforms often cease to work, especially in times of utmost need. While domestic banks are investing in digital technology, they continue to run a traditional model of branch-based acquisition and servicing of customers. Even some branchless banks are opening branches. Enter international banks and Fintechs; they are also rallying to get the digital banking license with the aim to provide affordable and inclusive financial services to the large population base in Pakistan. Considering the strengths of these players already operating in the digital banking space outside the country, the traditional domestic entities could be considered as a separate category so that the foreign enal segment will be a challenge when trants are encouraged to bring their expertise and capital to Pakistan. In fact, all domestic banks should be encouraged to digitalise their existing businesses and launch digital-only banks through their existing bank licenses or a domestic digital bank license category. At a time when Pakistan is struggling with dwindling foreign reserves, foreign capital investments could serve as a blessing in disguise to bring the much-needed investment to launch and build operations in Pakistan.



Saudi Arabia and Thailand sign landmark agreements on energy

BANGKOK: Saudi Arabia and Thailand on Friday signed landmark agreements on energy cooperation and renewable power during Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman's visit to Bangkok. The crown prince is a special guest of the Thai government at the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation leaders' meeting in the city. The main agreement on energy cooperation was signed at a meeting between Saudi Energy Minister Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman and Thai Energy Minister Supattanapong Punmeechaow. "It will be a framework to seek energy cooperation that will be beneficial to Thailand and Saudi Arabia in different dimensions such as petrochemical cooperation, hydrogen fuel, carbon capture and storage, circular economy develop-





ment, and low carbon technology, promoting energy innovation, exchanging useful information and experience regarding energy," Punmeechaow said. Representatives of ACWA Power, who are part of the Saudi delegation in Bangkok, also signed a deal on renewable power development with Thailand's state-owned oil and gas company PTT and the state-owned power supplier

Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand. The agreement to develop a green hydrogen/ammonia project in Thailand would "expand cooperation in the energy sector," Punmeechaow said. "Its objective is to push forward and develop hydrogen fuel in Thailand." A third agreement was signed by the Saudi Ministry of Investment and the Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand to promote energy transition, the Thai minister said. Thailand's energy policy focuses on reducing dependence on natural gas and fossil fuels to enhance energy security and reach its ambitious target of supplying 30 percent of power from renewable sources by 2037. Its current power generation mix comprises only 14.9 percent renewables. *Agencies*

Pakistani traders keen to buy tea, coffee from Ethiopia

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistani traders have expressed keen interest in buying tea and coffee from Ethiopia at affordable rates. "There is a huge demand of tea and coffee in Pakistan, but connectivity, quality control mechanisms and institutional linkages between the two countries are the need of the hour," said the members of a joint delegation of the Federation of Pakistan Chamber of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI) and Pakistan Tea Association in a meeting with Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary Jemal Beker Abdula.

The ambassador said work on establishing connectivity and institutional linkages between the two countries for social, economic, and political cooperation was underway intensively. The quality control was rigorous in Ethiopia and rest assured that there would be no compromise on export quality of tea and coffee from Ethiopia. He said confidence-building measures would also be taken for Pakistani traders so

that the bilateral trade between the two countries could go to the next level. The envoy said Ethiopia has surplus tea and coffee which could be exported to Pakistan at affordable rates. "Currently, Ethiopian tea is coming from other channels, but we are working on different agreements in collaboration with the Ministry of Commerce of Pakistan to enable Pakistan and Ethiopia to boost their trade in diverse areas", he remarked. He said his government was opening up Ethiopia by taking legal, institutional and economic reforms that ensure security, ease of doing business and support environment for FDI. "The Ethiopian Airlines will start its operations in Karachi by the beginning of next year," the ambassador announced in the meeting. He said he had already announced visit of an inclusive business delegation of Pakistan to Ethiopia so they could understand business dynamics there and establish business-to-business ties. *APP*

Oranges' prices may surge by 50 percent due to low production

ISLAMABAD: The prices of oranges may rise this winter as the production recorded very low (50 percent) due to acute canal water scarcity and unexpected higher temperatures during the flowering stage of plants, Pakistan Business Forum (PBF) said. PBF Vice President Ahmad Jawad said 'kinnow' (orange) exports will resume from 1st week of December and the rate at farm price will be Rs. 2,000 per mound, according to the notification of the district administration due to less quantity. In order to facilitate exporters, the State Bank of Pakistan should properly facilitate them precisely for Iranian and Russian markets to issue timely E-forms and make special arrangements for banking channels, he urged. Jawad lamented that the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) could not open formal banking channels

both for Iranian and Russian markets for the last couple of years due to which their potential could not be tapped. He said that the Iranian market can absorb between 60,000 to 80,000 tons of kinnow, while the size of the Russian-Ukrainian-Belarus market (the largest citrus importer in the world) for Pakistani citrus fruit may be doubled from the present around 50,000 tons within no time provided the government establishes proper banking links with the two markets. PBF official also said that with an average annual harvest of 2.4 million tons, citrus contributes about 30 percent to total national fruit production which is increasing at an annual rate of 1.5 percent for the last two decades or so. During this period its export has expanded rapidly by 17 percent per

Exxon Makes First Oil Discovery In Angola In 20 Years

United States' largest independent oil and gas company, Exxon Mobil (NYSE: XOM), has mostly focused its exploratory activities in South America. Exxon's exploits in Africa have been few and far between, with its last discovery on the continent coming nearly two decades ago. But Exxon has now announced that it has, together with its partners, discovered hydrocarbons in Block 15 off Angola in the Bavuca South prospect. This

Luanda: Over the past five years, the was the block's 18th discovery, but the first since 2003. According to Exxon, the Valaris DS-9 drillship drilled the Bavuca South-1 well 365 km northwest from the coast at Luanda in 1,100 m (3,608 ft) of water, encountering 30 m (98 ft) of good-quality, hydrocarbon-bearing sandstone. Exxon owns a 36% interest in the block, with BP Exploration Angola (24%), ENI Angola Exploration (18%), Equinor Angola Block 15 (12%) and Sonangol P&P (10%) being its partners. *Agencies*

Former US billionaire sentenced to 11 years in jail

SAN JOSE: Elizabeth Holmes, the founder of US startup Theranos, which offered fast and low-cost blood tests, was found guilty of fraud and sentenced to more than 11 years in prison on Friday. According to media reports citing court documents, a court in San Jose, California found Holmes guilty of three counts of fraud and one count of conspiracy after she allegedly deceived investors about the presumed efficacy of her company's blood-testing technology. Holmes was also ordered to pay a \$400 million fine. "This is a fraud case where an exciting venture went forward with great expectations only to be dashed by untruths, misrepresentations, plain hubris and lies," the judge said while handing down the sentence, as cited by Reuters. Holmes founded Theranos, which produced instant blood testing devices, in 2003. The technology became popular, and by 2015, Theranos' market capitalization soared to around \$9 billion. Holmes became the world's youngest female billionaire, with Forbes estimating her fortune at \$4.5 billion. Shortly after the startup's launch, however, patients began to complain about errors in Theranos devices, and by 2015, reports of fraudulent activity at the company



started to appear in the media, with whistleblowers accusing it of deceiving investors and customers about the capabilities of the technology. Following the scandal, Theranos was forced to shut down in 2018. Prosecutors initially asked for Holmes to be sentenced to 15 years in prison and fined \$800 million, reports indicate. Her lawyers asked for the sentence to be lowered to 18 months She will likely start serving her sentence in April next year, as she is currently expecting a child. Holmes' lawyers are now expected to file an appeal and ask the judge to allow her to remain free on bail during the appeal time. Forbes now estimates the value of Holmes' assets at \$0. Theranos' former operating chief, Ramesh 'Sunny' Balwani, was also found guilty of criminal fraud charges earlier this year. *Agencies*

Inflation in Japan highest since 1982

TOKYO: Japan's consumer price growth accelerated to a 40-year high in October, driven by a weak national currency and imported cost pressures, government data showed on Friday. According to the report, the nationwide core consumer price index (CPI) was up by 3.6% from a year earlier, showing the fastest pace of growth since 1982. Last month's jump exceeded the 3.5% rise expected by economists and the 3% gain seen in September. The rise in the index, which excludes volatile fresh food prices but includes oil products, confirmed that inflation remained above the 2% goal of the Bank of Japan (BOJ) for a seventh consecutive month. The report indicated that foreign supply constraints have driven up the prices of imported food, industrial commodities and manufacturing parts. A fall in the national currency yen, which in dollar terms is down by more than 20% this year, has added to the CPI, 406 were more expensive in rates at minus 0.1%. *Agencies*

NASA Moon mission 'exceeding' expectations

Washington: On the third day after lifting off from Florida bound for the Moon, the Orion spacecraft is "exceeding performance expectations," NASA officials said on Friday. The spacecraft is to take astronauts to the Moon in the coming years -- the first to set foot on its surface since the last Apollo mission in 1972. This first test flight, without a crew on board, aims to ensure that the vehicle is safe. "Today we met to review the Orion spacecraft performance... it is exceeding performance expectations," said Mike Sarafin, head of the Artemis 1 mission. The spacecraft's four solar panels, about 13 feet (four meters) long, deployed correctly and are providing more energy than expected, said Jim Geffre, the Orion manager at the Johnson Space Center in Houston. It is from that control center in Texas that the spacecraft is being piloted. Orion is already some 200,000 miles (320,000 kilometers) from Earth and preparing to perform the first of four main thrusts scheduled during the mission using its engines. This maneuver, which will take place early Monday morning, will bring the spacecraft as close as 80 miles (130 kilometers) from the lunar surface, in order to take advantage of the Moon's gravitational force. *APP*


