Violent protests erupt as Former PM Imran Khan detained Imran Khan arrested as per law: IHC

ISLAMABAD (Agencies): Pakistan's former Prime Minister Imran Khan was detained in the country's capital Islamabad on Tuesday, police have said. The arrest of the opposition leader has also been confirmed by his spokesman. The arrest was made as Khan arrived at Islamabad High Court for a hearing of a corruption case against him. Dozens of legal proceedings have been launched against the 70-year-old after he was pushed out of office more than a year ago. Witnesses told Reuters that as soon as the former premier entered the compound, armored vehicles and officers in full riot gear arrived on site. The gates leading to the court were reportedly blocked, with Khan soon being escorted out the building under heavy security.

The Islamabad High Court here on Tuesday ruled that Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf Chairman Imran Khan was arrested as per law. The National Accountability Bureau's (NAB) officials arrested the PTI chairman when he arrived in the Federal Capital from Lahore to appear before the IHC in connection with his bail petitions. The NAB Chairman NAB had issued Imran Khan's arrest warrants in the Al-Qadir Trust case on May 1 under sections 9A, 34A, 18A and 24A of the NAB Ordinance 1999. Imran Khan was accused of corruption and corrupt practices. He would be produced before the relevant court for physical remand by the Bureau within 24 hours. Earlier, IHC Chief Justice Aamer Faroog took notice of the arrest of Imran Khan when he



summoned the Inspector General of Police Islamabad, Secretary Interior and Additional Attorney General to appear within 15 minutes. The IGP and the Additional Secretary Interior appeared before the court. Later, the court held a recess of 30 minutes and also summoned NAB Director General and Prosecutor General to answer in the arrest matter of Imran Khan. During the course of the hearing, the chief justice asked whether anyone could be arrested from the court premises. The accused would have to be released if the court find any illegality in the arrest of the PTI chief. NAB Director General Rawalpindi Irfan Baig and Prosecutor General Sardar Muzafar Abbasi appeared before the bench following the court directives. Justice Aamer Faroog asked what was the procedure for the execution of NAB warrants. Whether NAB adopted the same procedure in every case as the court's prime concern was whether the arrest was legal or not, he added. Sardar Abbasi said no accused could be arrested from the courtroom due to the respect of the court. He said the Bureau had conducted the investigation of the Al-Qadir Trust case in detail. The in-

quiry was converted into an investigation as per the law on April 28 and then the NAB chairman issued arrest warrants for the PTI chief, he added. Media have reported that Khan's supporters have gathered in various cities in the country, from Gilgit in the north to Karachi in the south. Khan has led massive rallies and protest marches in Pakistan in the past. More than 100 cases have been registered against Khan in various courts in the country, with charges ranging from corruption to terrorism and sedition, following the politician's ousting from power in a parliamentary no-trust vote last April. Khan says the cases are politically motivated to crack down on his Tehreek-e-Insaf Party, arguably the most popular in the country. Many senior Khan aides have had cases registered against them in recent months and been arrested. The fresh political crisis comes as Pakistan and the International Monetary Fund are in talks aimed at resuming stalled funding of \$1.1 billion due in November from a \$6.5 billion program agreed in 2019. The measures have fueled the country's highest-ever inflation, some 36.4 percent in April. The IMF funding is crucial for Pakistan to avert default on its external payment obligations during a balance of payment crisis in which foreign exchange reserves have shrunk to just four weeks of controlled imports. Khan's arrest also comes in the wake of the army's warning about legal action over accusations by Khan that a serving military official, Maj. Gen. Faisal Naseer, was plotting to kill him.

Ryanair orders 300 Boeing 737 MAX jets

London (AFP/APP): Irish airline Ryanair Tuesday ordered 300 Boeing 737 MAX jets worth over \$40 billion at list prices, representing the US aerospace giant's latest big contract in a fast-recovering aviation market.

The announcement, comprising 150 firm orders plus 150 options for new fuel-efficient aircraft, represents "the largest order ever placed by an Irish company for US manufactured goods." said a statement from Ryanair, which is eyeing big growth over the next decade. The jets are set for delivery between 2027 and 2033, while airlines traditionally negotiate substantial discounts on list prices, especially for big orders. Executives did not release the financial details of the transaction, but Ryanair Chief Executive Michael O'Leary described the agreement as a "win-win" in airfares therefore driving our growth."

The order covers Boeing's new 737 MAX-10 aircraft, which have 228 seats, about 20 percent more than the current generation of comparable Boeing jets, O'Leary said. Sonko was on Monday handed a six-month suspended term that could jeopardise his bid for the 2024 elections. His possible elimination would significantly alter the contest, and could also lead to violence from his supporters. Sonko claims the judiciary is being used to sideline him from the vote. "The people have to mobilise to support Ousmane Sonko in this fight," Khalifa Sall, one of the coalition chiefs, told a press conference on Tuesday. He joined other heads of the Yewwi Askan Wi alliance in urging followers to turn out in force for an already-scheduled rally due this Friday, and for another protest a week later, on May 19. Sene-

To determine The test was 97 per cent accurate for SARS-CoV-2 and 95 per cent accurate for the most prevalent version of the hepatitis C virus found globally, the researchers reported in the journal Cell Reports Medicine. The simplified test developed by University of Florida scientists currently happens in one small test tube, but it could arrive at doctor's offices soon and, one day, become available as home tests that are as easy as a pregnancy test. "We are trying to build a home-based test that is as reliable as a lab-based test," said Pivush Jain Professor of chemical engineering who led the latest research. "Our objective is to develop a simple test that eliminates the need for expensive equipment and provides results in just 10 to 20 minutes," he added. Using AI, Jain's group developed a system known as a one-pot reaction now we are able to combine everybecause the entire test happens in one small test tube. These tests, based on a technology known as RT-LAMP, can amplify small portions of a virus's genome and produce a visible signal

the difference between a false positive and a true positive, Jain said he is combining another technology called CRISPR. However, the RT-LAMP technology requires a temperature of 150 degrees Fahrenheit, while CRIS-PR works best at 100 degrees Fahrenheit. That difference makes tests far more complicated requiring two separate reactions -- too complicated for at-home use. To bridge this gap, Jain's group turned to AI tools to analyse a CRISPR enzyme that thrives at 140 degrees and discovered changes to make it survive at 150 degrees. "It's very challenging for any human to do this kind of analysis on an enzyme. We didn't have to spend years; we could make these improvements in months," Jain said. "With everything working at the same temperature, thing in a true one-pot reaction we call SPLENDID." The team successfully verified their simplified SPLENDID test on clinical samples from patients with hepatitis C or Covid-19.



Changing Geopolitics

After recognising the plight of Syrians who have been embroiled in war for the past decade, and the counterproductive nature of isolationist policies, the Arab League decided to reinstate Syria's membership. The move came especially after conditions in Syria worsened due to the devastating earthquake that killed thousands across the country. Reminded of the importance of saving humanity, such a step is bound to not only normalise relations in the Middle East but promote agreements through which long-lasting peace can be secured. It was 10 years ago that the Arab League suspended Syria's membership after President Bashar al-Assad ordered a crackdown against protesters. This event proved to be a catalyst of further unrest, ultimately plunging Syria into a deadly civil war that has killed half a million people and displaced more than 23 million. Multiple solutions were employed to put pressure upon Assad's regime but none proved to be successful; most invited more division, resistance, resentment and above all, violence. It was only recently that tensions reduced after all attention was diverted towards the earthquake and ensuring that civilians are made a priority. Providing a steady and politically stable environment is part of that requirement and accordingly, China brokered the re-establishment of ties between Saudi Arabia and Iran. Now with the Arab League voting to have Syria back, there is hope that slowly solutions will be figured out to each of Syria's problems. On the other hand, Syrians themselves are worried about what this means for the political process that was already underway in the country. There have been multiple rounds of negotiation that demanded Assad to step down, a move he has been resisting. Political opposition groups are not willing to budge; neither is the government. But the League hopes that having Syria back will mean that the scope for reviving these attempts at forging an understanding will increase exponentially. And given the extent to which most Middle Eastern countries want to reduce US influence in the region, one can be sure of the fact that they will engage with this conflict with the dedication it deserves. In doing so, there are a few key factors that will help de-escalate tensions immensely; enabling the return of immigrants and providing them with the means to re-establish themselves in their home country. Furthermore, a direct line of contact is essential for quick and immediate communication. Lastly, the government has also promised that it will aid efforts against the sale of illegal drugs and weaponry.

Situationer: Convoluted saga of recording, leaking conversations

are probably the only issue that dominated the political discourse more than leaked audio clips. With politicians, apparently, at the receiving end, there have been widespread concerns over who's snooping on these conversations and how they are coming out. The second part is easier to answer. Most of these conversations were leaked on Twitter. Anonymous accounts first give a forewarning that a conversation is about to be leaked. Then comes the bombshell — a video with a black background and green soundwaves with subjects' pictures. Captions are also added to them for easier comprehension. Now comes the trickier part of the question. Who is recording them? The answer could be anyone's guess. While many suspect it to be the handiwork of spy agencies, some also blame professional hackers. The saga gets further convoluted as all spy agencies, without the distinction of civil or military have the ability and the legal cover to pry on the conversations. A report submitted before the Supreme Court in 2015 stated that the army's Inter-Services Intelligence and Military Intelligence and civilian Intelligence Bureau and police have the power to tap phone calls under Section 24 of the Telecommunication Act, 1996; Section 5 of the Telegraph Act, 1885 and Investigation for Fair Trial Act, 2013. Additionally, cellular companies, under the clause of "legal interference" in their licence, are bound to share phone call data with law enforcement agencies if required. Under the Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act, intruding on the privacy of an individual through electronic means is a serious offence. Section 21 of the law states that the use of electronic means to cause reputational damage or breach privacy could land a person in prison for up to seven years or up to a Rs5 million

— By Malik Asad Over the past few months, elections KP's ex-finance minister Taimur ISI to tap the phones of his political Jhagra are a few names on this unwanted list. The conversations of the family members of some politically-exposed persons have also surfaced. A recent leak purportedly was of a conversation featuring the mother-in-law of Chief Justice of Pakistan Umar Ata Bandial. Another purportedly featured the ex-CJP Saqib Nisar's son. According to PTI leader Maleeka Bukhari, the audios are being leaked systematically with politicians "the sole target". She added that under the law, intelligence agencies can record audio but with the permission of the relevant court. "I am against maligning politicians through such tactics and in case PTI will form its government I will make efforts to curb this menace," said Ms Bokhari, who served as the minister for state on law and justice during the previous PTI government. Interestingly, when Mr Khan was the prime minister, he defended the ISI's powers to record phone calls and even justified the bugging of the PM's Office. However, during a recent interaction with the court reporters, he said that he never defended the breach of privacy rights. The purpose of these leaked conversations is also questionable as they have no legal standing in any court of law, thanks to the parameters chalked out by the former CJP Asif Saeed Khan Khosa. In the case pertaining to the leaked videos of former accountability judge Arshad Malik, the ex-CJP set tough standards for the admissibility of electronic evidence. Talking to Dawn, former chief justice Saqib Nisar said that he heard a case of phone tapping and also set some parameters for using these conversations as evidence. He said he also summoned relevant officials and worked out the restrictions for phone tapping to protect privacy. Since the hearing was in-camera, the ex-CJP said he could not divulge more details.

The 'sordid' history

The history of Pakistan has seen numerous instances in which leaked call recordings stirred a political story. Most were in the time when telephones were the only source of communication. Some believed that Zulfikar Ali Bhutto was the first prime minister to have ordered the opponents after protests broke out against his government in 1977. In 1996, tapping phones was one of the reasons for the ouster of former prime minister Benazir Bhutto. The then chief justice, Sajjad Ali Shah took suo motu notice after he found that his phone was bugged. Later, during the proceedings of a case against Ms Bhutto's ouster, the counsel of former president Farooq Ahmed Leghari justified his client's actions by stating that Ms Bhutto's government was taping the phones of Supreme Court judges. In 2001, the sitting judge of Lahore High Court, Justice Malik Qayyum, had to resign after his audio recordings with Shehbaz Sharif surfaced. In 2015, late Senator Mushahidullah Khan referred to an audio tape of former ISI DG Lt Gen Zaheerul Islam recorded by the IB. In the audio clip, Lt Gen Islam could be heard inciting PTI's protestors to take over the PM House during the party's sitin of 2014, as per Mr Khan's claims who added that the then Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif had played it to the then ex-COAS Gen Raheel Shar-

All in on it

The game of recording audio and in selective cases, even leaking them - is played by both civilian and military sides. An IB official said spy agencies, his own, have the resources to record audio conversations. However, he claimed that spy agencies never use their resources to breach the privacy of citizens as recording gadgets were purchased from the taxpayers' money and to be used for national security purposes. According to an official of a spy agency, provincial governments have also acquired the equipment for tapping phone calls. He said that since intelligence agencies are capable of recording audio, therefore, they provide it to the government. The military's spokesperson did not respond when Dawn contacted him for comments. Some of these conversations are even acquired from cellular networks. The relationship between Russia and others. The United States and Europethe West has been marked by tension and conflict for several decades. The most recent source of conflict in recent years has been Moscow's invasion of Ukraine. Ukraine, a former Soviet republic, has deep cultural, economic and political ties with Russia. However, these have been strained by the recent conflict in a manner that could have long-lasting effects. Russia's annexation of Crimea in 2014 was a major turning point in its relations with not only Ukraine, but also the West. It led to the imposition of sanctions by Western countries. The war in eastern Ukraine, where pro-Russian separatists have been fighting against the Ukrainian government, has also been a major source of tension. Its infamous paramilitary, the Wagner Group, is operating in a number of conflict areas, including Libya and is said to be providing Sudan's Rapid Support Forces (RSF) with weapons in its recent battle against the national army. Egypt, which has suffered greatly as a result of the global disruption to grain supplies as a result of Moscow's actions in Ukraine, benefits from Russian investment - including in its nuclear energy endeavours - and support for Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi's coup government. Earlier this year, a leaked US intelligence report uncovered secret negotiations between Cairo and Moscow, in which Egyptian President Al-Sisi and his government planned to transport 40,000 rockets to Russian forces.





The release of water at Kalabagh, Taunsa, Guddu and Sukkur was recorded as 60,800, 58,000, 40,600 and 10,100 cusecs respectively. Similarly, from River Kabul, a total of 35,600 cusecs of water was released at Nowshera and 15,200 cusecs were released from River Chenab at Marala.

Saudi Aramco's Q1 net profit rises 3.75% q-o-q to \$32bn

RIYADH (Agencies): Saudi Arabian Oil Co. has reported a net profit of SR119.54 billion (\$31.88 billion) in the first quarter of 2023, up 3.75 percent from SR115.22 billion recorded in the previous quarter. In a statement to Tadawul, Saudi Aramco said that the rise in quarter-on-quarter net profit was driven by lower income taxes and zakat, lower operating costs, and higher finance and other income. "The results reflect Aramco's continued high reliability, focus on cost and our ability to re-



act to market conditions as we generate strong cash flows and further strengthen the balance sheet," said Amin Nasser, CEO of Saudi Aramco. Aramco's net profit, however, dipped 19.25 percent year-on-year in the first quarter, as the company had

clocked a profit of SR148.03 billion in the same quarter of 2022. Nasser further noted that oil and gas supplies are very critical components as the world sails toward a sustainable future. He asserted that Aramco is working hard to develop sustainable energy solutions that will smoothen the energy transition journey. "Our intention is to continue to be a reliable energy supplier with the ability to provide more sustainable energy solutions, supporting efforts to achieve an orderly energy transition.

Mitsubishi Corp plans US\$2.2bil buyback as profit soars

TOKYO (Agencies): Mitsubishi Corp. plans to buy back up to 6% of its shares for 300 billion yen (US\$2.2 billion), joining other commodity-exposed Japanese companies that are rewarding shareholders after reporting surging profits. The trading house will conduct the buyback from May 10 through the end of the year, it said Tuesday as it also announced fiscal year earnings, including a 62% jump in profit from its natural gas operations. Mitsubishi will then retire



all the shares on Jan 31. Mitsubishi and other Japan-based firms with exposure to commodities are using the proceeds of last year's surge in energy prices to carry out buyback programmes. Shares of Sumitomo

Corp jumped on Tuesday after it said it would purchase its own stock, while Tokyo Gas Co and Mitsui & Co have also announced similar plans since February. The trading companies, collectively known as "sogo shosha" in Japan, have a sprawling network of businesses including stakes in commodity projects overseas. They have benefited from a surge in energy prices and a weaker yen, as well as a vote of confidence following renewed backing by Berkshire Hathaway Inc.

Twitter beats 2 lawsuits stemming from mass layoffs, for now

NEW YORK (Agencies): A California federal judge on Monday dismissed a proposed class action accusing Twitter Inc of targeting female employees for layoffs after Elon Musk acquired the company last year, but said plaintiffs would be allowed to amend the lawsuit to add more details. US district judge Jon Tigar in Oakland said the lawsuit filed in December was "devoid of basic information," such as the



plaintiffs' positions with Twitter and the identity of managers who decided which workers would be laid off. Tigar also said that allegedly sexist remarks made by Musk and cited by the plaintiffs were irrelevant because they came long before he acquired Twitter for US\$44 billion last year. The decision came after a different judge in the same court on Friday dismissed a separate lawsuit accusing Twitter of discriminating against workers with disabilities by requiring employees to report to the office and put in long hours working at high intensity after the layoffs in

Australia eyes first budget surplus in 15 years

CANBERRA (Agencies): source-rich Australia is projecting its first budget surplus in 15 years, the country's treasurer said Tuesday, heralding a commodities-fuelled victory for the year-old centre-left government. "We are now forecasting a surplus this year, smaller deficits after that," Jim Chalmers told media, hours before unveiling what is expected to be a A\$4 billion (US\$3.6



billion) surfeit. Chalmers touted the "biggest budget turnaround on record" as evidence of "responsible economic management", as his party

seeks to define itself as careful custodians of the public purse. The Labor party came to office in May 2022 after nearly a decade of conservative rule that saw state coffers strained by the Covid-19 pandemic, sweeping tax cuts and soaring defence spending. A conservative government led by Scott Morrison promised a budget surplus in 2020 but was unable to deliver due to the pandemic.

Bittrex files for bankruptcy after SEC complaint

NEW YORK (Agencies): Cryptocurrency exchange Bittrex Inc filed for bankruptcy protection on Monday, three weeks after the US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) accused it of operating an unregistered securities exchange. Seattle-based Bittrex ceased operations in the US on April 30, and it said the bankruptcy filing would not impact Bittrex Global, which serves customers out-



side the US. The company's non-US operations are based in Liechtenstein. Bittrex's assets and liabilities were both between US\$500 million and US\$1 billion, according to a bankruptcy petition filed in Wilmington, Delaware court. Bittrex said that it was still holding crypto assets of US customers who did not withdraw funds before April 30. Those assets are "safe and secure" and Bittrex said it intended to ask the bankruptcy court for a limited re-opening of customer accounts so that the crypto could be distributed back to customers.

Al could replace 80% of jobs 'in next few years'

RIO DE JANEIRO (Agencies): Artificial intelligence could replace 80% of human jobs in the coming years – but that's a good thing, says US-Brazilian researcher Ben Goertzel, a leading AI guru. Mathematician, cognitive scientist and famed robot-creator Goertzel, 56, is the founder and chief executive of SingularityNET, a research group he launched to create "Artificial General Intelligence", or AGI – artificial



intelligence with human cognitive abilities. With his long hair and leopard-print cowboy hat, Goertzel was in provocateur mode last week at

Web Summit in Rio de Janeiro, the world's biggest annual technology conference, where he told AFP in an interview that AGI is just years away and spoke out against recent efforts to curb artificial intelligence research. "If we want machines to really be as smart as people and to be as agile in dealing with the unknown, then they need to be able to take big leaps beyond their training and programming.

Ryanair close to mega 150 Boeing 737 Max deal

LONDON (Agencies): Days after the World Health Organization declared the coronavirus pandemic over, Ryanair Holdings Plc is betting big on the travel recovery that's gathered pace in recent months as bookings soar for city trips and summer vacations. Europe's largest discount airline is close to placing a major order with Boeing Co for about 150 of the 737 Max 10 aircraft. The deal, set to be announced as early as Tuesday, includes the possible addition of 50 options, according to people familiar with the deliberations, who asked not to be identified discussing confidential negotiations. The huge purchase of Boeing's largest 737 variant marks an important endorsement



from one of the US manufacturer's most important customers and highlights how carriers are willing to splurge on fleet upgrades again as travel rebounds. Saudi Aramco posts 19% drop in first-quarter profit

RIYADH (Agencies): Oil giant Saudi Aramco announced first-quarter net profit of US\$31.9 billion on Tuesday, down 19.25% from a year earlier after a drop in crude prices. "We are... moving forward with our capacity expansion, and our long-term outlook remains unchanged," president and CEO Amin H Nasser said in a statement. The result was down from the US\$39.5 billion reported in the same period in 2022 when Russia's invasion of Ukraine caused oil prices to surge. It is more than three-quarters of the US\$40.5 billion in combined first-quarter profits reported by the five oil majors: BP and Shell in Britain, ExxonMobil and Chevron in the US, and TotalEnergies in France.



"The results reflect Aramco's continued high reliability, focus on cost and our ability to react to market conditions as we generate strong cash flows and further strengthen the balance sheet," Nasser said. Aramco is the jewel of the Saudi economy and the main source of revenue for Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman's ambitious economic and social reform programme known as Vision 2030.

EU lawmakers eye ambitious AI regulation

BRUSSELS (Agencies): The sudden popularity of ChatGPT and other AI tools is injecting urgency into Europe's drive to regulate the sector, which this week gets rolling seriously with an ambitious text to be voted on by EU lawmakers. The EU aims to be the global pioneer in creating a comprehensive legal framework that would rein in possible online harm while still protecting innovation in the field of artificial intelligence. The massive complexity of the systems, and their ability to produce text and images that at times mimic human output, is proving as fascinating as it is concerning. Faced with the risk of AI being used to



make dangerous content, manipulate opinion, conduct mass surveillance or other perils yet to emerge, even tech leaders such as Twitter boss Elon Musk have called for a pause in its development. The burgeoning use of AI by the public and corporations is outstripping action by Brussels, which two years ago proposed initial draft legislation to tackle the issue.

S'pore's wealth fund sees fintech growth after downturn

SINGAPORE (Agencies): Singapore's sovereign wealth fund said it still sees more growth in the financial technology sector, even after a downturn that's sent startup valuations plummeting as investors turn away from riskier bets. Chris Emanuel, head of GIC Pte's technology investment group, said the fund is excited about innovation in financial product distribution that brings opportunities to scale across the world. It also sees opportunities in enterprise software as digital transformation efforts "increase across sectors in both startups.

The Federal Reserve's quarterly Senior Loan Officer Opinion Survey (SLOOS) showed that while credit conditions for US businesses and households continued tightening at the start of the year, it was likely due to the impact of the Fed's aggressive rate hikes rather than severe banking sector stress. The closely-watched survey released on cuts needed later this year to ease the Monday was among the first measures



of sentiment across the banking sector since the recent run of bank failures, sparked by Silicon Valley Bank's collapse in March, had spread turmoil in global markets. The US dollar rode Treasury yields modestly higher after the survey, as traders pared back their expectations on the scale of Fed rate stress on the sector.



Bolivian general who captured Che Guevara dies at 84



BOGOTA (Agencies): The Bolivian general who captured Argentina-born Cuban revolutionary Ernesto Che Guevara and became a national hero died at the age of 84. Gary Prado Salmo died in a hospital in the country's Santa Cruz province, his son Gary Prado Arauz announced on Facebook on Saturday. "He leaves us a legacy of love, honesty, and grace. He was an extraordinary person. Thank you to everyone who supported us in this time of agonv. God bless vou." Arauz said. Born in 1938, Salmo who was paralyzed in the spine in 1981 after being accidentally shot, retired from the army in 1988. Guevara was captured in Bolivia on Oct. 9, 1967, in a joint operation of the Bolivian army and the US Central Intelligence Agency. He was executed at a school in rural La Higuera, about 800 kilometers (497 miles) from Bolivia's administrative capital La Paz.

Western Canada seeks urgent help to fight wildfires



(Agencies): Canada struggled on Monday to control wildfires that have forced thousands to flee, halted oil production and razed towns, with the western province of Alberta calling for federal help. Some 30,000 people were ordered to leave their homes over the past three days, as nearly 100 fires flared across the province -- including 27 out of control. Federal disaster officials and the military were on standby, after Alberta leader Danielle Smith spoke with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau to formally ask for assistance. "Canadians stand with the people of Alberta as they deal with these terrible, terrible wildfires," Trudeau told reporters in Ottawa. "We were watching images from the communities affected by these wildfires and I assured Danielle that we will be there to help," he said. Details of what supports would be made available were not immediately released. In Alberta, firefighters prioritized dousing flames threatening homes and businesses. Many roads near the provincial capital Edmonton were blocked off as temporary shelters welcomed evacuees. Officials said 390,000 hectares had burned, patients and long-term care residents had to be relocated and many schools were closed. Oil firms -- including Vermilion Energy and Crescent Point Energy -- announced temporary shutdowns of operations, slashing production by more than 125,000 barrels of oil per day. Many residents and oil workers rode to safety in motorhomes or with campers in tow, and set up in empty parking lots. Others are staying with friends or family, like Jerry Greiner, a resident from Dayton Valley, west of Edmonton, the capital of Alberta.

"A decent locally grown strain goes for 300 baht [\$9] per gram but imports are only 150-180 baht [\$4.50-5.30] per gram," Prajya Aura-ek, a cannabis entrepreneur with several licensed dispensaries in Bangkok, told Al Jazeera.

Control & Disarmament Centre (ACDC) at the Institute of Strategic Studies Islamabad (ISSI), in collaboration with Sustainable Peace and Development Organization (SPADO), organized a seminar on "Lethal Autonomous Weapon Systems (LAWS): A Regional Perspective" on Tuesday. The seminar was well attended with the participation of members of the diplomatic community, academia, experts from think tanks, officials from relevant department representatives of civil society, and university students. In his welcome remarks, Director General ISSI Amb. Sohail Mahmood said that the transformative potential of new and emerging technologies like robotics, Artificial Intelligence (AI) and machine learning was affecting every facet of human civilization. These technologies had now spread to over 100 countries,

dual-use nature of these technologies had also led to massive commercial use and raised concerns that non-state actors could use these technologies for malicious purposes. In May 2013, Pakistan became the first country to call for a ban on fully autonomous weapons. It had repeatedly advocated for a ban on autonomous weapons and was spearheading the efforts internationally to have a legally binding instrument. Director ACDC-ISSI, Malik Qasim Mustafa said that increasing weaponisation of AI was generating insecurity and fear and presented complex security challenges for states and added that the development of these weapons had raised

tion, autonomy, accountability and state responsibility and their likely impact on human protection instruments like international human rights and Instrumental Humanitarian Law. Chief Executive, SPADO, Raza Shah Khan, noted that the "Global Movement to Ban Killer Robots" had been active for more than a decade and comprised 150 non-governmental organizations from 60 countries working to retain meaningful human control over the use of force by banning the development, production, and use of fully autonomous weapons. They aimed to get a consensus on an international legally binding instrument on LAWS. There was already support of 90 states as well as the Secretary General of the UN in favour of a legally binding instrument on LAWS; however, several major countries were resisting a consensus-based approach.

Russia has sparked a "mad panic" as ed with nuclear material, he said. Russia has told people to leave 18 settlements in the Zaporizhzhia region, including Enerhodar near the plant, ahead of Kyiv's anticipated offensive. The Ukrainian mayor of Melitopol, Ivan Fedorov, said there were five-hour waits as thousands of cars left. The UN's nuclear watchdog warned a "severe nuclear accident" could occur. Speaking to the BBC's Newshour programme Rafael Grossi - the director of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) - said the evacuation of residents near the nuclear facility indicated the possibility of heavy fighting between Russian and Ukrainian forces around the plant. Although its reactors were not producing electricity they were still load-

Grossi added that he had had to travel the plant a few weeks ago. Earlier, the IAEA warned in a statement that situation at the Zaporizhzhia facility was "becoming increasingly unpredictable and potentially dangerous". Operating staff were still at the site but there was "deep concern about the increasingly tense, stressful, and challenging conditions for personnel and their families". It said IAEA experts at the plant had "received information that the announced evacuation of residents from the nearby town of Enerhodar - where most plant staff live - has started". On Friday, the Russian-installed regional head Yevgeny Balitsky said that "in the past few days, the enemy has stepped up shelling of settlements close to the front line".


Balochistan govt restored deceased quota
