

## Pakistan pays for Russian oil in yuan

ISLAMABAD (Agencies): Pakistan has paid for its first shipment of crude oil from Russia in Chinese yuan, Reuters reported on Monday, citing Pakistani Petroleum Minister Musadik Malik. The cargo was delivered to Karachi port thanks to a deal struck by Russia and Pakistan in January. The first order under the deal was placed in April. Malik did not disclose any other details on the price or discounts applied to the purchase. According to the outlet, the transaction in yuan represents a significant shift in Pakistan's US dollar-dominated export payments policy. Russia signed the oil deal with Pakistan as part of a drive to diversify its export avenues after it was slapped with a collective ban by the EU, the G7, and their allies in December, along with a price cap of \$60 per barrel. Moscow redirected its



#### effectively cut Moscow off from the Western financial system. According to previous reports, Pakistan had agreed to a per-barrel price of around \$50-52 for Russian crude. Last year, the country imported 154,000 barrels

The hope is that discounted Russian crude will help stabilize oil prices in the country, which is facing high external debt, a weak local currency, and critically low foreign exchange reserves.

#### Ten dead in Australia wedding bus crash



SYDNEY (AFP/APP): Ten people have died in a wedding party bus crash in Australia's Hunter wine region in New South Wales, police said Monday, announcing the arrest of the 58-year-old driver. The light-coloured coach lay on its side after the accident, with a dozen emergency workers wearing high visibility yellow vests nearby in the foggy night, television images showed. The toll may yet rise, with 25 passengers taken to the hospital — two of them airlifted from the crash by helicopter, said Acting Assistant Commissioner Tracy Chapman. Police were not aware of any children being involved, she said. The coach driver was subjected to mandatory testing at the hospital, the police officer told reporters at the scene. "He's under arrest. He's been the driver of a motor vehicle collision where there have been fatal injuries and there will be charges pending," she said. The passengers had been at a wedding together, the officer said and were presumed to have been heading to their accommodation after the festivities.

#### Unabomber died by suicide – AP

Ted Kaczynski, known to the FBI as the 'Unabomber,' died by suicide, the Associated Press reported on Sunday. Kaczynski, who was 81 and suffering from late-stage cancer, was found dead in his North Carolina prison cell a day earlier. Four sources described by the Associated Press as people "familiar with the matter," told the agency that Kacynski had ended his own life. The sources did not reveal how the 81-year-old cancer patient actually did this and also said they weren't authorized to publicly discuss his death. According to the Federal Bureau of Prisons, Kaczynski was found unresponsive in his cell early on Saturday and was rushed to hospital, where he was pronounced dead. He had been held in the federal Supermax prison in Florence, Colorado, since 1998 but was moved to a medical center in North Carolina in 2021 to receive treatment for cancer. An autopsy has not yet been carried out on Kaczynski's body.

#### Iran says indirect talks with US continue via Oman

TEHRAN: Iran on Monday said it has continued indirect negotiations with the Unites States through the Sultanate of Oman over its nuclear deal and a possible prisoner swap. Iran's nuclear program has long been the subject of scrutiny from Western powers, resulting in sanctions that have crippled the country's economy. A 2015 deal granted Tehran much-needed sanctions relief in exchange for curbs on its nuclear program before it was torpedoed by the United States' unilateral pullout in 2018. In recent days, the two capitals have denied media reports that they were close to reaching an interim deal to replace the 2015 accord. "We welcome the efforts of Omani officials and we exchanged messages with the other party through this mediator" over the lifting of US sanctions, Iran's foreign ministry spokesman Nasser Kanani said Monday. "We have never stopped the diplomatic processes," he added during his weekly press conference, emphasising that the talks "were not secret." Diplomatic ties between Tehran and Washington soured



in 1980 following the 1979 Islamic revolution led by Iran's first supreme leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini. Efforts to revive the 2015 nuclear deal have so far failed to yield results. Iran's supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei on Sunday reiterated the denial of moves toward acquiring a nuclear weapon. He also said deals could be reached, provided they do not change "the existing infrastructure of the nuclear industry." Iran and its arch-nemesis the United States have also been involved in Oman-mediated talks over a possible prisoner swap. Kanani on Monday said a prisoner exchange could be agreed "in the near future," provided that Washington exhibits "the same level of seriousness" as Tehran.

#### PLA deploys new Y-9 reconnaissance plane as US and Japanese Carriers hold drills east of Taiwan Island

BEIJING (Agencies): Chinese military sources have confirmed that the People's Liberation Army (PLA) has deployed a state-of-the-art reconnaissance aircraft to monitor and collect information on an ongoing naval exercise conducted jointly by the United States, Japan, France, and Canada in the Pacific waters east of Taiwan. The exercise involved the participation of two US Navy carrier strike groups, led by the USS Nimitz and USS Ronald Reagan, along with Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force's helicopter carrier JS Izumo, and surface units from Canada and France. The South China Sea Strategic Situation Probing Initiative, a Beijing-based think tank, closely monitored the joint drill and reported that the US carriers had been operating in the waters around the Ryukyu Islands in the Philippine Sea since Thursday. The strategic significance of this sea re-

gion, located to the east of Taiwan, lies in its potential for the PLA to encircle the island and deter foreign military interference. Experts warn that control over this region by external forces could provide support to pro-"Taiwan independence" secessionist groups. Simultaneously, Japan's Ministry of Defense Joint Staff announced the sighting of a PLA Y-9 reconnaissance plane over the West Pacific, marking the first confirmation of this specific aircraft type. The defense authority in Taiwan reported 37 PLA aircraft and five vessels in the vicinity of the island, including fighter jets, bombers, aerial tankers, communications countermeasures aircraft, and a reconnaissance drone. Analysts speculate that the PLA reconnaissance aircraft likely gathered intelligence on the joint exercise, while PLA bombers potentially conducted mock target training.

#### Egypt refuses to hold funeral for officer who killed Israel soldiers

CAIRO (Agencies): Egyptian security services refused to hold a funeral for policeman, Mohamed Salah Ibrahim, who carried out the Egyptian-Israeli border operation resulting in the death of three Israeli soldiers and the wounding of a fourth, in an exchange of gunfire. Mada Masr quoted two sources close to the soldier's family saying, "the agreement between the family and the security authorities was that a funeral would be held after the burial took place secretly and quickly," and that the family would postpone the funeral until Tuesday "so the number of attendees would be reduced." But the security authorities have since informed the family of their refusal to hold a funeral. I The site stated that hundreds of Egyptians went to Salah's house in the Ain Shams area in the capital, Cairo, yesterday to attend the funeral "but Ain Shams investigation forces dispersed them." #### Vehicle fire causes major US highway collapse


WASHINGTON (AFP/APP): A fire ca's busiest highways to collapse early on Sunday in Philadelphia, authorities said, as reports attributed the cause to a truck that burst into flames under the bridge.The collapse took out four traffic lanes along an elevated section of heavily traveled Interstate 95, though no injuries were immediately reported. "Companies arrived on location and they found.. heavy fire from a vehicle — we don't know what type of vehicle it was," Captain Derrick Bowmer, of the Philadelphia Fire Department, told a news conference. Bowmer added the situation was considered a hazmat incident, but could not confirm reports that the burning vehicle was an oil tanker. Federal and local law enforcement are looking for the driver, whose whereabouts are unknown, local media reported. The north-south highway - one of the busiest in the United States, connecting major cities along the East Coast from Maine to Florida remains closed in both directions in the Philadelphia area, officials said. Rebuilding the section of destroyed highway could take weeks, authorities said, a nightmare scenario for commuters as




well as for road travelers at the start of the summer holiday season. "Avoid area. Plan and seek alternative travel routes," the Philadelphia Office of Emergency Management said in a tweet. US Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg said on Twitter he is offering "any assistance that USDOT can provide to help with recovery and reconstruction." Television images showed flames and billowing smoke coming from the crumbled section of I-95 in the northeastern city's Tacony neighborhood, with parts of the elevated roadway having fallen onto the lanes below. City authorities issued a series of alerts on Twitter about a tanker truck fire on the highway, which local media reported caught fire underneath the bridge, apparently causing the collapse. A city spokeswoman told AFP that a "large fire under I-95" caused the highway to collapse, but did not attribute it to any vehicle. She said the fire has been declared "under control."



With a dismal ranking of 145 out of 146 countries in Gender Equality, the urgency of today's discussion is evident. There has been a distressing surge of crimes like rape as eight were reported in the last 48 hours. Public spaces and workplaces have become breeding grounds for such heinous crimes. Simultaneously, it is crucial to generate widespread awareness about consent, respect, and gender equality. This can be achieved through educational initiatives, public campaigns, and community engagement programs that dismantle harmful social norms and foster empathy and respect. Moreover, the government must prioritise the formulation of effective laws and ensure their strict implementation to hold perpetrators accountable. The rising number of rape cases throughout the country demands urgent action from the government, law enforcement agencies, and society as a whole. Protection centres and increased security measures are essential but must they be accompanied by a broader shift in culture and mindset. This requires addressing gender inequality, implementing effective laws, and promoting awareness. The time for change is now, and the government must take the lead in shaping a society that upholds the rights and dignity of all its citizens.

# A New Chapter In The Caucasus? Armenia And Azerbaijan Make Strides Towards Peace

On June 1, during the course of his visit trilateral statement issued on January to Chisinau, Moldova, to attend the second summit of the European Political Community (EPC), Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan announced that the next meeting of the foreign ministers from his country and Azerbaijan will take place in Washington on June 12 (Armenpress.am, June 1). Although it has been postponed since, the Azerbaijani side declared that the new date will be announced soon (Modern.az, June 8). If it indeed takes place, this will be the second meeting of the two ministers hosted by the United States, after their four-day peace talks in the US capital in early May 2023 (see EDM, May 8). Following this meeting, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken stated that the two South Caucasus republics were "within reach of an agreement" (State.gov, May 4). Indeed, multiple meetings have taken place since then between representatives of the two countries at various levels, resulting in some noteworthy advancements. The European Union-mediated summit of Armenian and Azerbaijani leaders in Brussels on May 14 and the Russian-mediated foreign ministers' meeting in Moscow on May 19 (see EDM, May 23) had provided a good basis for subsequent talks between the two sides. Most importantly, the recognition of the Karabakh region as part of Azerbaijan by Pashinyan, which has historically been a point of contention between both countries, was a remarkable impetus for the peace process (Consilium.europa.eu, May 14). In the aftermath of these two meetings, the long-awaited trilateral summit of Armenian, Azerbaijani and Russian leaders took place in Moscow on May 25. This trilateral gathering was organized on the sidelines of the summit of the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU), where Azerbaijani President Ilham Aliyev took part as a guest for the first time (President.az, May 25). A few hours before the resumption of high-level peace talks in Moscow, which had not taken place since the summit in Sochi on October 31, 2022, Russian media announced that "at least two documents" would be signed. According to the Russian daily Kommersant, one of these documents was expected to be signed by the deputy prime ministers involved in a separate negotiation track, with a particular emphasis on reopening regional trans-

12, 2021, signed by Azerbaijan, Armenia and Russia (Kommersant, May 25). The other document was anticipated to be another joint statement issued by the leaders of the three countries. However, the trilateral meeting did not deliver any signed documents or yield any major breakthrough. Some Azerbaijani media reported that the Armenian side was not interested in the adoption of any document (Qafqazinfo, May 25). The verbal battle between the leaders of Armenia and Azerbaijan at the EAEU summit received more attention from observers. Here, Aliyev and Pashinyan, in the presence of Russian President Vladimir Putin and other EAEU leaders, argued about the perception of "corridor," which is a debatable topic as Armenia rejects this term in relation to the transportation passage widely referred to as the "Zangezur Corridor." Aliyev reiterated to the Armenian leader that the use of this term does not contain any territorial claims against Armenia and that he uses this term in the same way when referring to the "North-South Corridor and East West Corridor" (President.az, May 25). That said, perhaps the most important outcome of the Moscow summit was the re-activation of the working group of both countries' deputy prime ministers to discuss transportation projects. Following the trilateral summit, Putin noted that the sides were close to a final deal on re-opening transportation links and that the remaining issues were "purely technical" (President.az, May 25). On June 3, the working group met for the 12th time and reported to have reached a "common understanding" concerning "the implementation of concrete steps for the restoration and organization of the railway connection on the Arazdevan-Julfa-Mehri-Horadiz route" (Apa.az, June 3). The group statement avoided using the term "Zangezur Corridor," which is widely used to refer to the aforementioned route. Both sides, nevertheless, reported "important progress" in talks about the "modality" of these transportation links without giving further details. Progress in this direction has also been observed in the increasing use of the Azerbaijani checkpoint on the Lachin road by Armenians traveling in and out of the Karabakh region (Azernews, June 3).

### Biofloc fish farming— a boon or bane — By Sohail Akhtar

opting for latest techniques, Biofloc fish farming is yet to click as experts desire more focus and patronage by the authorities to promote this practice on mass scale. The farmers in South Punjab who practiced this new technique came across hiccups and challenges like provision of uninterrupted power supply, provision of chemicals on affordable prices and overall atmosphere to promote this culture. But it is fact that Biofloc fish farming attracted farmers and many among them immediately opted for this new technique that recycles waste nutrients as fish feed wherein specifically cultured micro-organisms, are mixed with water to form microbial protein from fish waste and other organic matter in the water. Biofloc is a modern concept of high-density fish rearing wherein fish are nurtured in a water tank, made of turbulent sheet. Fish seeds are put into water tank also mixing probiotics (a kind of bacteria) into it to convert materials like Ammonia, Nitrate, and Nitrite into feed. The probiotic in tank consumes ammonia and converts it into protein to be used by fish inside the tank as feed. Biofloc helps in cleaning the culture water of the fish while giving an additional source of feed. It is a sustainable and eco-friendly process. For Biofloc farming the species must be resistant to environmental changes, tolerant to high stocking density, adapt to changes in dissolved oxygen and be able to take microbial protein as food. Despite that Biofloc farming can help address the food security issues, some experts are skeptical about its success in our peculiar atmosphere. It needs round-the-clock power supply and oxygen besides chemical(s) to keep the water clean," says DG Fisheries South Punjab Dr Anser Mahmood Chattha. "Given high

technology was actually viable for doing profitable business." Chatha said that biofloc fish farming was a special method to produce fish, originally introduced for shrimps in Indonesia and South East Asia and declared it costly as it needed 24 hours supply of energy and oxygen. He said that the fisheries department was further conducting research on this technology and it would be to clearly say something about the technology's applicability in south Punjab with the business point of view after a few years. "We are also working on other options and start shrimp farming would in the next one or two years under public-private partnership as shrimps attract the premium price from lucrative markets and investment on biofloc," he said. "By the time Biofloc fish farming is South Punjab is approximately one percent of total fish farming." There are 20 fish hatcheries operational in the region with seven being run by the Fisheries Department and 13 by private sector. DG Fisheries was confident that fish farming could become more profitable through value addition and efforts are already on in this direction. "Our department provides farmers 80% subsidy to fish farmers for installation of cage clusters in different rivers." Meanwhile, a progressive fish farmer Muhammad Naveed Gul who owns fish farms at Head Muhammad Wala complains of power outage and costly inputs. "I had invested around Rs 1.5 million to develop four 10-marla biofloc water tanks but had to suffer losses due to high cost of inputs, lack of 100 percent monitoring and inconsistent power supply." For instance, he said, in recent days power supply remained suspended for some time and the half of the fish seed died. "So I immediately dismantled the system, shifted remaining

MULTAN: With some farmers ages no one can say for sure if the fish seed into traditional fish ponds from tanks after suffering a loss of hundreds of thousand rupees." "I invested in Biofloc after getting information from books and websites. But now I believe, it was very difficult to run this business without government support, proper education and provision of resources.' He urged the government to come up with plans for solar systems to ensure uninterrupted power supply for biofloc units and reduce cost of inputs including chemicals. Muhammad Saleem, another fish farmer in Multan also pleaded to lower input prices and proper marketing of fish produced from Biofloc to make this business viable. "The government should come up with a comprehensive strategy to promote this business." Among these farmers, some were very confident about success of Biofloc system. "This technology is profit generating and involves lesser cost as failures are mostly result of mistakes and lack of determination,' said Nauman Bodla, a young farmer from Shujabad. He informed that initially he had set up a couple of tanks in his village but now he has 16 tanks, all operational. "My first year in this business ended with break-even only recovering the cost. The second year was in loss due to my own mistakes. But, this year I expect a sizeable profit." He said Biofloc needs proper monitoring as initially farmers come across some problems but solutions to these problems also exist. "It would be unwise to disregard the technology as farmers can overcome losses by not repeating their mistakes." By the time, fish farming spans over 38,000 acre across South Punjab with 2805 registered farmers and this business can further flourish with the patronage of the government and concerned authorities.

Brent crude futures fell 89 cents, or 1.19 percent, to \$73.90 a West Texas Intermediate crude was at \$69.33 a barrel, also down 1.20

SHANGHAI (Agencies): Chinese electric vehicle maker Nio Inc slashed starting prices on all of its models by 30,000 yuan (US\$4,200), days after reporting a worse-than-expected quarterly loss. Monday's move further entwines Nio with others including Tesla Inc in a price war to grab more customers in China, the world's biggest EV market. The Chinese government also last week started a campaign to boost car purchases and clean-car adoption, particularly in ru-



ral areas, after sales growth of EVs and plug-in hybrids slowed to 41% in January-May from 120% a year earlier. "This adjustment has been discussed internally for a long time," CEO William Li said in a post on Nio's

app. "There were many things to consider and even until 3am this morning we were still deliberating. Now is the most appropriate time." The price changes take effect immediately, Nio said. Nio's sales dipped below 13,000 vehicles in April and May combined from 31,041 in January-March. The Shanghai-based company, which still aims to sell 250,000 EVs this year, said last week its first-quarter net loss widened to 4.74 billion yuan from a deficit of 1.78 billion yuan a year earlier.

FRANKFURT (Agencies): The European Central Bank will almost certainly deliver another interest rate hike on Thursday, pressing ahead with its fight against inflation even as the eurozone slides into a recession. Analysts predict that ECB policymakers will copy May's move and again raise borrowing costs by 25 basis points, taking the closely watched deposit rate to 3.50%. It would be the Frankfurt institution's

NEW YORK (Agencies): Goldman Sachs Group Inc. one of the most bullish banks on the outlook for oil, has once again lowered its price forecasts amid increasing global supplies and waning demand. The bank has now dropped its Brent forecast for December to US\$86 a barrel, down from its previous estimate of US\$95 a barrel. This is Goldman's third downward revision in the last six months after hav-



ing previously stood by its bullish US\$100-a-barrel prediction. Brent's August contract settled at US\$74.79 a barrel on Friday. "We have never been this wrong for this long without seeing evidence to change our views," Jeff Currie, Goldman's head of commodities research, said in a Bloomberg Television interview last week. Supply increases from nations facing sanctions - Russia, Iran and Venezuela — are a key driver in the lower price outlook, according to Goldman. Russia supply production, in particular, has "nearly fully recovered" despite sanctions from Western countries.

#### Germany refusing Intel's demand for subsidies for €17bil factory

BERLIN (Agencies): Germany's finance minister Christian Lindner is refusing Intel's demands for higher subsidies for a €17 billion (US\$18 billion) chip plant, saying the country could not afford it, the Financial Times reported today. "There is no more money available in the budget," the newspaper quoted Lindner as saying in an interview. "We are trying to consolidate the budget right now, not expand it." The company was due to receive €6.8 billion in government support for its fabri-



cation plant in Germany. However, due to higher energy and construction costs, it is now demanding about €10 billion, the newspaper reported. Intel did not immediately respond to Reuters request for comment out-

The company announced last year it had picked the central German city of Magdeburg for a new chip-making complex as a part of an US\$88 billion investment drive across Europe, which included boosting a factory in Ireland, a packaging and assembly site in Italy and setting up a design and research facility in France. 

His goal cancelled the lead Yahia Attiyat Allah gave the defending champions and earned the Cairo club a 3-2 aggregate victory after building a 2-1 first-leg lead seven days ago. Ahly scored 27 goals in 14 matches en route to continental glory and four of them came from Egypt centre-back Abdelmonem. Defeat for Wydad ended a run of two final victories over Ahly,



and they paid the penalty for concentrating on defending their fragile second-leg lead instead of seeking further goals. Unlike Europe, away goals count double in African club competitions when sides finish level on aggregate

and Wydad would have retained the trophy had they won 1-0. Ahly pocketed a record four million Dollars for winning and Marcel Koller became the first Swiss coach to win the premier African club competition. It was the third Champions League triumph in four seasons for Ahly after victories over fellow Egyptians Zamalek in 2020 and Kaizer Chiefs of South Africa the following year. Wydad made two changes to the side that began the first leg in Cairo last weekend with attackers Mohamed Ounajem and Saifeddine Bouhra replacing Reda Jaadi and Zouhair el Moutaraji.

PARIS (Agencies): Novak Djokovic created history on Sunday when he captured a record-breaking 23rd Grand Slam title with a third French Open triumph, reinforcing his case to be crowned the greatest player of all time. The 36-year-old Serb brushed off an early wobble to defeat Casper Ruud of Norway 7-6 (7/1), 6-3, 7-5 and snap the tie of 22 Slams he shared with career-long rival Rafael Nadal. "It's an incredible feeling to win 23. I'm beyond grateful and blessed to be standing here with so many incredible achievements," said Djokovic as Nadal immediately described his rival's victory as "an incredible achieve-



ment". Victory for the third time in Paris, after 2016 and 2021, adds to Djokovic's 10 Australian Open titles, seven at Wimbledon and three at the US Open. "It's no coincidence that my 23rd Grand Slam title has come here Djokovic's sights at Wimbledon next because it has been the hardest one

for me to win in my career. I am very emotional right now and I am very, very proud," added Djokovic who fired 11 aces and 52 winners in total past Ruud. Djokovic is the first man to win all four majors at least three times and is once again halfway to the first calendar Grand Slam since Rod Laver in 1969. 
## Champions League hero Rodri: Manchester City can build European 'legacy'

#### Several killed, wounded in Vietnam police station attacks

HANOI (APP): Several people were killed and wounded in shootings at two police headquarters in Vietnam's Central Highlands on Sunday, authorities said. Sixteen people were arrested in connection with the shootings in Cu Kuin district of Dak Lak province, according to state media, citing To An Xo, spokesman for the ministry of public security. Two people being held hostage by the attackers were freed, To added, while another person being held managed to free himself. The attacks on the police headquarters of both Ea Tieu and Ea Ktur communes occurred in the early hours of Sunday, according to the official website of the ministry of public security. The site said a number of people, including police, local officials and civilians, were killed and wounded but did not provide exact figures. Investigators were searching for more suspects, it added. Police could not be reached for comment. The Central Highlands, home to a number of ethnic minorities, is considered a sensitive area for Vietnam's authoritarian govern-ment and has long been a hotbed of discontent over issues that include land rights. Some tribes in the area -- collectively known as Montagnards -- sided with the US-backed south during Vietnam's decades-long war. Some are calling for more autonomy, while others abroad ad-vocate independence for the region.

UNITED NATIONS (APP): A new UN society more broadly, dampening the expansion of human development," said Pedro Conceicao, head of UN-DP's Human Development Report Office. A staggering 25 per cent of people believe it is justified for a man to beat his wife, according to the report, reflecting the latest data from the World Values Survey. HOUSTON (Agencies): Thousands of fish washed ashore along the Texas Gulf Coast due to "a low dissolved oxygen event" in warm water, US officials have said. Quintana Beach County Park officials said on Sunday that the species most impacted by this fish kill was the Gulf menhaden, adding that the pedestrian beach is mostly cleared with the "exception of a spattering of fish that the machinery couldn't get". Thousands of fish washed ashore along the Texas Gulf Coast due to "a low dissolved oxygen event" in warm water, US officials have said. get". Warm water holds much less oxygen than cold water, and fish that find themselves in warm water could end up in big trouble. "When the water temperature rises above 21 degrees Celsius (70 degrees Fahrenheit), it becomes hard for menhaden to receive enough oxygen to survive," the statement said. "Shallow waters warm more quickly than deeper, so if a school of menhaden are trapped in the shallows as the water begins to heat, the fish will start to suffer from hypoxia."

# Magnitude 5.0 quake hits S.Africa's largest province

5.0-magnitude earthquake on Sunday struck near Johannesburg, shaking buildings across South Africa's most populous province, the Unites States Geological Survey reported. The tremor struck at 2:38 am (0038 GMT) around 10 kilometres (six miles) below the surface, the USGS said. Buildings shook across the province of Gauteng, where Johannesburg, the country's largest city and commercial hub, is located. Residents across the province felt the tremor and some posted pictures on social media showing minor structural damages of walls. Emergency services department reported neither casual-

#### Israel: New bill to detain PA officials active in Jerusalem



Israel's Ministerial Committee for Legislation yesterday discussed a draft law stipulating the detention of Palestinian Authority (PA) officials who are active in occupied Jerusalem, Arab48 reported. The detention in the proposed law is based on the claims that action by PA officials in Jerusalem violates Israel's sovereignty in occupied East Jerusalem. Religious Zionist Party MK Zvi Sukkot proposed the bill claiming that it is part of the Oslo Accords, pointing out that the accords included a condition that the

PA officials must not interfere in Israel's internal affairs. Sukkot said that this term remained dead because the Oslo Accords did not stipulate punishment for violators. The MK also claimed that many PA officials have interfered in the affairs of the Arabs in Israel, mainly in relation to the education system in the occupied city of Jerusalem. Sukkot proposed five years in prison for any PA official charged with interfering in the Israel's internal affairs, and ten years in prison if the interference included threats.

#### Mother of rescued Colombia children survived four days after jungle crash

BOGOTÁ (Agencies): The mother of "Before she died, their mom told them the four Indigenous children rescued after 40 days lost in the Colombian jungle remained alive for four days before succumbing to her injuries suffered in the May 1 plane crash, her widower said Sunday. The Uitoto Indigenous children - ages 13, nine, five and one -- were found alive Friday by rescuers, having wandered alone in the Amazon rainforest since the crash of a small Cessna 206 plane on which they were traveling with their mother, the pilot and another adult. All three adults died in the accident, but Manuel Miller Ranoque said his injured wife survived briefly -- with their children beside her. "The one thing that (13-year-old Lesly) has cleared up for me is that, in fact, her mother was alive for four days," Ranoque told reporters next to the military hospital in Bogota where the children are being cared for.

#### First post-Covid jab claims land in German courts

**FRANKFURT** (Agencies): Vaccine-maker BioNTech faced Monday its first legal claim in its home country of Germany over adverse effects allegedly suffered by some users of its Covid vaccines, more than two years after one of the world's fastest and most extensive inoculation campaigns. In the face of the deadly pandemic that emerged in early 2020, which prompted border closures and lockdowns that trapped millions of people in their homes, the arrival of Covid vaccines had been widely hailed as a life-saver. But the jabs, which had been developed at breakneck speed and granted early approval for usage, are now the focus of legal procedures in several countries including France and Britain where plaintiffs argue that the vaccines harmed their health. In Germany, a court in Hamburg was prepared to hear a case from Monday against BioNTech, which, together with US giant Pfizer, produced the first mRNA vaccine Comirnaty. The hearing was delayed however after the claimant's lawyers put in a last-minute challenge of the judge's impartiality, and asking instead for a panel of judges to rule on the case. In her claim, the plaintiff reported suffering effects including "pain in the upper body, swelling of the extremities, exhaustion, fatigue and sleeping disorders" after receiving the vaccine, the court said. She is seeking 150,000 euros (\$162,000) in damages and recognition that the "defendant is bound to provide material damages", the court added. Her lawyer Thomas Ulbrich, who is also representing another 250 people in similar cases, said his clients were "all healthy" before suffering from symptoms, allegedly following their jabs.

#### Cholera epidemic over in Lebanon: Health Ministry



The Lebanese Ministry of Public Health announced yesterday that the cholera epidemic has ended in the country, with no new infections recorded since the end of February. The ministry noted that the World Health Organisation (WHO) recommends announcing the end of a cholera outbreak no less than four weeks after the last laboratory-confirmed recorded case, adding that its decision is based on the opinion of the National Committee for Communicable Diseases, according to the statement. Last October, the Lebanese Ministry of Health recorded the first cholera infection in the country for the first time in three decades. The epidemic constituted a big challenge for Lebanon which I has been struggling through what the World Bank has said is one of world's worst financial crises in over a century.
