#### Turkiye President's upcoming visit to Qatar to boost cooperation, ties

ANKARA (Agencies): An upcoming visit to Qatar by Turkiye's President will help boost bilateral ties and cooperation, according to the Gulf nation's ambassador in Ankara, Anadolu Agency reports. "This visit is an important indicator of the solid relations that bind Turkiye and Qatar," Sheikh Mohammed bin Nasser bin Jassim Al-Thani told Anadolu ahead of President Recep Tayyip Erdogan's visit to Qatar on Tuesday as part of a three-day Gulf tour. "Most likely, the visit will encompass several areas of coordination and joint cooperation," he added. Erdogan is also scheduled to visit Saudi Arabia on Monday and the United Arab Emirates on Wednesday. Bin Nasser said the agenda of Erdogan's visit to Doha would include international and regional issues, as well as means of expanding investments between the two countries. "This year, we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between the two countries," the ambassador said. "These relations have developed and expanded to cover various economic, security, military, political and other fields," he added. The diplomat said that Turkiye and Oatar have many areas of joint cooperation. "The two sides are working constantly to expand these areas, and remove obstacles that may impede the achievement of the desired success," he added.

#### Iran, UN officials discuss Afghanistan as Taliban invited to Moscow

TEHRAN (Agencies): Iran's Foreign Minister discussed the situation in Afghanistan with the UN's point man on the war-torn nation, as Russia has invited ruling Taliban officials to a meeting in Moscow, Anadolu Agency reports. Tehran's top diplomat, Hossein Amirabdollahian, met on Sunday with Feridun Sinirlioglu, the special coordinator of the US Secretary-General for the independent assessment of Afghanistan affairs, the Iranian Foreign Ministry said in a statement on Monday. Tehran is "ready" to advance regional initiatives on Afghanistan, Amirabdollahian told Sinirlioglu, emphasising the "central role" of the UN on the issue. The meeting came a day after Moscow invited Afghanistan's de facto Taliban rulers for a meeting on Afghanistan. Russian Ambassador to Afghanistan, Dmitry Zhirnov, on Saturday extended an invitation to the Taliban administration during a meeting with acting Foreign Minister, Mawlawi Amir Khan Muttagi.

### Five-nation group on Lebanon says to penalise those obstructing presidential election

AMMAN (Reuters): The five-nation group on Lebanon, which comprises the U.S., France, Saudi Arabia, Qatar and Egypt, said on Monday they had discussed several measures against politicians and groups who were obstructing the election of a new president. Last month parliament failed - for the 12th time - to fill the post, reserved for a Maronite Christian in Lebanon's sectarian system and vacant since the term of the Hezbollah-allied Michel Aoun ended in October. The meeting in Doha attended by Lebanon's key Western and Arab donors and allies said it was imperative a president was elected and urged Lebanon's leaders to overcome a deepening institutional paralysis in a country where one of the world's worst economic crises has been festering for years. "We discussed several options including taking measures against those who obstruct progress in this area," said the communique, without elaborating on the steps. The stand-off has played out along sectarian lines, with Christian parties supporting Jihad Azour, the IMF's Middle East director and an ex-finance minister, and Shi'ite factions Hezbollah and Amal against him. The stand-off has laid bare Lebanon's deep splits, with the heavily armed Iran-backed



Hezbollah deploying its political might against Azour's bid to fill the vacant presidency, while continuing to campaign for its ally - Suleiman Frangieh. Last week the European Parliament also blamed Hezbollah and Amal and their allies for resorting to what it said were unconstitutional tactics to prevent the conclusion of the vote and deepening the political deadlock. Lawmakers from Hezbollah and allies withdrew from the last session to obstruct a bid by the main Christian parties to elect Azour. Hezbollah and its allies have close ties to Syria and Iran, while their opponents in the Christian and Sunni Muslim communities traditionally look to the West and Sunni-led Gulf Arab states. Washington has also warned its administration was considering sanctions on Lebanese officials for their continued obstruction of the election of a new president and warned the paralysis could only worsen the country's political crisis.

Later, in 2022, he jumped to the JUI-F. Khattak revealed his exit from the PTI in a phone call with the media on Sunday. He stressed that even if his efforts to join a new party fail, he will not revert to his previous political allegiance. Khattak was terminated from PTI membership after failing to answer a notice about allegedly trying to break away PTI members in KP.



Once sorted and cleaned, plastic is shredded into flakes and melted to form pellets before finally being molded into new products. We have also installed a filter at the furnace to make the emission less pollutant and less harmful for humans and environment," Arsalan told newsmen. The objective of Trash Bee was the same of earning money, but in an environmental friendly manner, ensuring that the practice was not harmful for humans, he remarked. The starts up is in its initial stages but also is making a contribution through donation from its meager earning to varsities for carrying out research and development in proper disposal of plastic waste. Quoting a figure of United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), Arsalan said Pakistan generated approximately 20 million tons of solid waste annually,

of which 5 to 10 percent was plastic waste. Plastic pollution not only affects the environment but also human health, as plastic waste can release harmful chemicals into the soil and water, and be ingested by animals, which can then enter the food chain. "Through proper recycling, we can treat to some extent some amount of plastic waste and can also transform this resource as a source of income and creation of livelihood," he opined. Arsalan also disclosed that Trash Bee was also producing wooden cutlery through use of bamboo wood to discourage utilization of plastic. The cutlery of bamboo wood was totally environmentally friendly, durable and is also disposable in waste dumps, he claims. After cutlery, Trash Bee will also produce additional house hold items made of bamboo wood to introduce a new and environmental friendly source of raw material which can be used instead of hazardous plastic. "While realiz-

ing severity of environmental degradation in Pakistan and its impact on people of the country, it is need of the hour to embrace green skills and convince our coming generation to become a catalyst for a greener and brighter future," suggested Dr. Ejaz Ahmad, Senior Fellow Institute of Urbanism. According to Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), it is also binding on our government to include the target of upgrading infrastructure and retrofitting industries to make them sustainable with increased resource-use efficiency and greater adoption of clean and environmentally sound technologies, he continued. IoU is also striving for `Building of a Sustainable Future' and in connection with world `Youth Skills Day' to be observed on July 15, is promoting the concept of green skills for educating the young generation to unlock their green potential and empower themselves with sustainable skills, Dr. Ejaz added.

# Free speech no excuse for allowing religious

hatred — By Dr. Majid Rafizadeh Religious hatred unfortunately appears to be on the rise, making it very important for governments across the world to take the appropriate actions to adequately address this critical issue. A recent incident in Stockholm — at a protest that was authorized by the Swedish authorities — saw the public burning of a copy of the Qur'an. This caused outrage among many governments. Turkive condemned the decision by the Swedish authorities to hatred." It calls for accountability and approve the protest, while dozens of condemns all kinds of religious hapeople stormed the compound of the tred, including "public and premedi-Baghdad. Other Muslim countries, including Pakistan and Iran, called for Sweden to be held accountable. Saudi Arabia and Indonesia condemned the incident, with the latter describing it as an act of Islamophobia. Pakistani Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari last week told the UN Human Rights Council via a video link: "We must see this clearly for what it is: incitement to religious hatred, discrimination and attempts to provoke violence." He added that such incidents happened under "government sanction and with the sense of impunity." Instead of bridging gaps between communities and promoting peaceful coexistence, such actions only promote violence, tear societies apart, escalate hatred toward a specific community and create rifts between different religions and ethnic groups. First of all, it is important to point out that free speech should not be used as an excuse to allow the promotion of hatred toward a specific group or religion. While Germany's ambassador to the UN Katharina Stasch called the acts in Sweden a "dreadful

provocation," she also pointed out that

"freedom of speech sometimes also

means to bear opinions that may seem

almost unbearable." However, burning

a holy book must not be considered an

act of free speech; instead, it should be regarded as hate speech. Just as the German penal code bans publicly denying the Holocaust and disseminating Nazi propaganda, burning a holy book should also be prohibited. In a step in the right direction, a motion was filed at the UN Human Rights Council. The body approved a resolution that urges countries to "prevent and prosecute acts and advocacy of religious Swedish Embassy in Irag's capital, tated acts of desecration of the Holy Qur'an." Pakistani Ambassador Khalil Hashmi pointed out that the opposition to the resolution of a few countries "emanated from their unwillingness to condemn the public desecration of the Holy Our'an or any other religious book. They lack political, legal and moral courage to condemn this act, and it was the minimum that the council could have expected from them." To combat religious hatred, such actions should be taken seriously, exposed and denounced publicly. Silence will only empower and embolden those who attempt to divide society through hatred and violence. This is why it is critical to pressure political leaders to take action in the fight against religious hatred. Rallies that advance hate should also be prohibited. More fundamentally, acceptance, diversity and inclusiveness should be promoted. This important objective can be achieved through proper education and the raising of awareness of prejudices, stereotypes and bigotry. Education ought to be anchored in respecting different religions, ethnicities and faiths. In addition, advancing interfaith and intercultural dialogue is vital. This is crucial when it comes to reducing tensions and conflicts across the globe.

## As NATO looks for answers to the Ukraine conflict, Poland seeks the nuclear option— By Scott Ritter

- The ambitions of individual NATO following the 2020 Presidential election members only bring the world closer to a nuclear catastrophe

The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) has wrapped up its two-day summit in Vilnius, Lithuania. While issues of NATO expansion (Turkey's unexpected about-face which opened the door to increased NATO membership) and the ongoing conflict in Ukraine dominated the headlines, when it came to the one topic with inherent existential consequences – the request by Poland that it enter a nuclear-arms-sharing arrangement with the US that would see Washington's B61 nuclear bombs deployed on Polish soil - NATO remained silent. According to the request from the government of Prime Minister Mateus Morawiecki, these weapons would be turned over to specially trained Polish air-force crews for use in any future NATO conflict with Russia. Left unsaid is the reality that any conflict which had Poland delivering nuclear weapons against a Russian target would almost immediately escalate into a general nuclear exchange between the United States and Russia, inevitably resulting in the destruction of most if not all of humanity. The Polish request was prompted by the recent Russian decision to deploy tactical nuclear weapons in Belarus, where they will be married up with SU-25 aircraft and Iskander-M missiles operated by specially trained Belarusian crews. The Russia-Belarus nuclear sharing arrangement is part of an overall reassessment by Russia of its nuclear posture in the face of a strategy embarked-on by the United States and NATO that seeks a strategic defeat of Russia in Ukraine. The Russia-Belarus nuclear sharing agreement closely parallels a similar arrangement between the US and NATO, where about a hundred B-61 nuclear bombs are stationed on the soil of four NATO nations, where they will be shared with the air forces of five NATO nations (Turkey, Belgium, the Netherlands, Italy, and Germany) in a time of war. The decision to deploy nuclear weapons on Belarusian soil, and to have Belarusian military assets prepared to employ them in a time a war, is indicative of the close relationship that has emerged

The Russia-Ukraine conflict has only drawn the two nations closer Morawiecki's request isn't the first time the issue of US nuclear weapons on Polish soil has arisen. In 2020 Richard Grenell, then-US ambassador to Germany, and Georgette Mosbacher, then-US ambassador to Poland, engaged in a Twitter exchange prompted by German hesitancy to continue its participation in the NATO nuclear sharing arrangement that saw 20 B-61 bombs deployed on German soil. Berlin's aging fleet of Tornado fighter bombers was due to retire in the coming years, and German parliamentarians were balking at the projected expense of replacing them with new US-manufactured fighters. Ultimately Germany agreed to purchase 35 of the F-35A aircraft, at a cost of \$8.4 billion. Germany will begin training on the aircraft in 2026 with an eye on having the first F-35A fighters operational by 2028. The issue of Poland joining NATO's nuclear sharing arrangement resurfaced in October 2022 when Polish President Andrzej Duda, alarmed by the conflict between Russia and Ukraine, publicly appealed for the US to station B-61 nuclear bombs on Polish soil. This request, however, failed to gain any traction in either the US or NATO. Duda's request, however, was not beyond the pale. In April 2022 the director of the NATO nuclear policy directorate, Jessica Cox, announced that NATO military planners were updating the mechanics of NATO's nuclear sharing program to take into account the acquisition by many NATO members of the F-35A fighter. Four of the five nations involved in this nuclear sharing arrangement (Belgium, Italy, the Netherlands, and Germany) had agreed to transition to the F-35A (Turkey was supposed to but ran afoul of US sanctions over its purchase of Russian S-400 surface-to-air missiles.) Cox indicated that NATO planners were looking at the possibility of integrating F-35A aircraft scheduled to be purchased by Poland, Denmark, and Norway into the nuclear sharing mission (it is assumed that Finland, which recently joined NATO and is purchasing F-35A aircraft, would be part of this integration as well.) Cox's plans did not call for the deployment of nuclear weapons onto the soil of these nations, but rather the use of their aircraft in a nuclear role. Morawiecki's request was linked to Poland's future acquisition of F-35A aircraft, leading to the possibility that a compromise could be agreed-to that would see US nuclear bombs remain on German soil but turned over to Polish aircrews in time of war. Poland recently inked a \$6.5 billion deal with the US for the purchase of 32 of its F-35A fighters, the delivery of which is scheduled to begin in 2024. While the Polish request to enter the NATO nuclear sharing arrangement was not publicly addressed during the Vilnius Summit, the NATO communique issued at its conclusion hinted at what the future may look like for both Poland and the NATO nuclear deterrent. NATO, the communique noted, "will take all necessary steps to ensure the credibility, effectiveness, safety and security of the nuclear deterrent mission. This includes continuing to modernize NATO's nuclear capability and updating planning to increase flexibility and adaptability of the Alliance's nuclear forces, while exercising strong political control at all times. The Alliance reaffirms the imperative to ensure the broadest possible participation by Allies concerned in NATO's nuclear burden-sharing arrangements to demonstrate Alliance unity and resolve." While it is unlikely that either the US or NATO will, in the future, accede to the Polish Prime Minister's request to station US B-61 bombs on Polish soil, the NATO communique appears to pave the way for Poland's F-35A fleet to be integrated into the pool of aircraft available to NATO to deliver those bombs if a nuclear conflict were to ever break out between NATO and Russia. While the alliance may view such an outcome as contributing to the viability of the NATO nuclear deterrent, the reality is all it does is guarantee that Russia will be compelled to view every F-35A in the NATO arsenal as a potential nuclear threat going forward and to adjust its own response accordingly. This puts NATO and Russia closer to the possibility of nuclear conflict, an outcome no rational actor could ever view as contributing to the collective peace and security of Europe. - Courtesy: RT





## China's youth unemployment to worsen after record high

BEIJING (Agencies): China's youth unemployment rate hit a record in June — marking a third consecutive month above 20% — and the government warned the situation may get even worse as new graduates start looking for work. The jobless rate for people aged between 16 and 24 was 21.3% last month, the National Bureau of Statistics said Monday. That's the highest on record in data that goes back to 2018, and NBS spokesman Fu Linghui



said the number for July would likely be higher still. Young people are finishing their studies and looking for jobs, adding to upward pressure on the unemployment rate, Fu told a

press briefing Monday. The government has said it expects a record of nearly 12 million students to graduate from colleges and universities this year. Youth unemployment has been at high levels for more than a year as Covid disruptions and a property slump add to existing structural problems in the labour market. The flagging recovery in the world's second-biggest economy is now likely making employers reluctant to hire.

## Rate hikes hit UK wealth but young people could gain

LONDON (Agencies): The jump in interest rates has wiped more than £2 trillion off household wealth in Britain over the last year due to the fall in house prices and the value of bonds which has hit pensions, a report published on Monday showed. But the Resolution Foundation thinktank said younger people could benefit from the partial reversal of the decades-long climb in the value of household wealth. The Bank of England has raised borrowing costs 13



taking its base rate from 0.1% to 5%, and it is expected to keep on raising rates to bring down the highest inflation among Group of Seven nations. "The future path of interest rates is times in a row since December 2021, very uncertain," Ian Mulheirn, re-

search associate at the Resolution Foundation, said. "The current surge could be a blip, or herald a new era for the UK. Either way, policymakers should focus more on whether and how to insulate households from wild swings in their fortunes from these forces well beyond their control." The Resolution Foundation said £2.1 trillion (US\$2.75 trillion) had been lost in terms of household wealth over the last year after an unprecedented surge in recent decades which took wealth to £17.5 trillion in 2021.

### Global debt dominates as G20 finance chiefs meet

GANDHINAGAR (Agencies): G20 finance ministers and central bank chiefs opened talks Monday on debt restructuring deals, multilateral bank reform and finance to tackle climate change, as they aim to bolster a sagging global economy. Indian finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman, chair and host of the summit in Gandhinagar, began by telling finance leaders of "the responsibility we have... to steer the global economy towards strong, sustainable, balanced and inclusive growth". Key on the two-day



agenda will be "facilitating consensus to intractable issues associated with rising indebtedness", Sitharaman said earlier on Monday, speaking to reporters alongside US Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen. Talks will

also focus on "critical global issues such as strengthening the multilateral development banks and taking coordinated climate action", Sitharaman added. Yellen said: "The world is looking to the G20 to make progress on key challenges like climate change and pandemics as part of our work to strengthen the global economy." She also cited work to tackle debt distress among the world's poorest countries, noting debt restructuring progress in Zambia, which she had discussed when visiting Beijing this month.

## Indonesia eyes 5% growth despite China's grim outlook

JAKARTA (Agencies): Indonesia finance minister Sri Mulyani Indrawati said she was optimistic about the 5% economic growth target this year despite the darkening global outlook, especially from China. "We are optimistic for 2023 because we see the figures on the first half," Indrawati said on Sunday in an interview with Bloomberg Television's Haslinda Amin ahead of the G-20 finance chiefs' meetings in India. Southeast Asia's largest economy flashed another round of



warning signs on Monday, with exports plunging 21% in June due to the sharp drop in global commodity prices. More worryingly, soft domestic demand pushed imports down 18% last month, lower than

all the forecasts in a Bloomberg survey of economists. "The second half, there is a positive side from our own side, explicitly on household consumption," Indrawati said, adding that elections next year will spur the economy thanks to extra spending from the government as well as political parties. Her comments came as finance chiefs from the world's largest economies grapple with the risk of a global recession, brought about by high interest rates and still-elevated inflation.

## Vietnam's big LNG bet may not ease power crisis

HANOI (Agencies): Vietnam received its first shipment of liquefied natural gas this month, a milestone for the energy-hungry country, but various hurdles mean it could take years for imported gas to ease the country's long-running power shortages. Disagreement over pricing, plant construction delays and lack of supply contracts are dogging the Southeast Asian manufacturing hub's adoption of LNG, hampering its ambitions to make imported gas a major fuel, in-



dustry insiders say. Vietnam's urgent need to boost its electricity supply, laid bare by recent rolling blackouts, has raised concerns among foreign investors about whether Vietnam can

remain a reliable option to diversify manufacturing away from China. Half the businesses in a June poll by the European Chamber of Commerce in Vietnam said the power crisis had hurt investment plans. Some were considering alternatives or pausing spending on factories. Failure to execute its LNG plans would mark another blow to Hanoi's climate goals, which include imported and domestic gas as a transition fuel to reduce coal reliance.

## Musk told to focus on Tesla as EV rivals pounce

NEW YORK (Agencies): Right on cue, Tesla Inc sceptics are pushing back after this year's sizzling US\$500 billion rally. Rival automakers pouncing on booming demand for electric vehicles pose the biggest challenge for Tesla over the next two years just as Elon Musk appears distracted thanks to his high-profile ventures, from social media and space travel to artificial intelligence. So say respondents to the latest Markets Live Pulse survey. Out of 630 global MLIV Pulse contributors, 54% flagged the heightened risk of industry competition while 26% picked the behaviour and



decisions of its mercurial chief as a key concern for Tesla shareholders. "Musk is just such an unpredictable person, that I would count it among one of the top risks for Tesla," Matthew Tuttle, chief executive officer of Tuttle Capital Management, said in an interview. As profit margins thin, some 67% of survey partici-

pants said the billionaire executive should focus more on the carmaker. Their warning comes in the wake of a seemingly improbable 128% Tesla rally this year, fuelled by renewed investor appetite for the tech mega caps and Musk's prediction that the era of fully autonomous vehicles is nigh. Even though Tesla currently enjoys a sizable lead over other companies, be it an established carmaker or a startup, a big part of its remarkably high market valuation rests on the assumption that it will be able to maintain this dominance in a future where EVs are more commonplace.

## S'pore home sales hit 6-month low on limited supply

SINGAPORE (Agencies): Singapore's home sales slumped last month to the lowest since December as a lack of sizable launches and the government's latest cooling measures kept potential buyers at bay. Purchases of new private apartments fell to 278 units in June, from 1,038 the previous month, Urban Redevelopment Authority figures showed Monday. That's the lowest since December 2022, when 170 homes were sold after tight supply curbed demand. The dip in sales suggests that Singapore's red-hot property market may finally start to moderate after the nation largely defied a global slowdown from Canada to China. Private home prices fell for the first time in



three years in the second quarter on the back of the latest property curbs. Analysts expect the Singapore market to pick up as the supply of homes rises. After only one 17-unit launch last month, new home sales will likely rebound in July owing to a few large development launches such as Lentor Hills Residences and The Myst, according to Christine Sun, senior vice president of research and analytics at OrangeTee & Tie.

#### Dollar gains after steep losses as US policy peak looms

SYDNEY (Agencies): A bruised dollar took respite on Monday after suffering its worst weekly drop of the year, as traders waited on economic data and policy decisions before selling it down any further. The euro, which jumped 2.4% last week to a 16-month high, held just below that peak at US\$1.1223. The yen, also up 2.4% last week, held at 138.56 per dollar. Chinese growth data landed a little above low expectations on Monday, but without sparking much currency market response as traders had already priced in a sluggish quarter and are waiting to see if the government steps up stimulus to promote spending. 

## Scary high-speed crash, described as 'one of ... if not, the biggest' in Formula E, leaves multiple cars unable to continue

High-speed racing is accustomed to high-speed collisions, such is the nature of the sport. But rarely have we seen a crash as dramatic as what took place on Saturday during the first of Formula E's double-header of races in Rome. On turn six of the ninth lap, Jaguar driver Sam Bird - leading the race at the time - appeared to lose control of the back of his car before colliding with the barrier to spin his car into the middle of the track. This, as it turned out, was a particularly bad bit of luck for Bird who was unable to move in the middle of the track on a blind corner where cars travel at extremely high speeds. 2016/17 Formula E drivers champion Lucas di Grassi later called the corner "probably the most dangerous on this track." In the immediate aftermath, multiple cars made slight contact with Bird's car, in particular Envision Racing's Sebastien



Buemi who hit the back of the Jaguar car, launching Buemi up and into the wall at an angle before he landed back down. While other drivers were able to narrowly avoid a serious collision, while still making contact, the same could not be said about Maserati MSG Racing's Edoardo Mortara who drove straight into the side of Bird's car. The race was immediately red flagged and delayed for 45 minutes. In total, six drivers could not continue in Saturday's race because of their involvement in the crash. The frustration of the driv-

"I had zero problem physically and the car had minor damage compared to what could have been, so in one way, we have been lucky today that nothing more serious happened. "Thanks to the FIA and Formula E Safety requirements, also, not only for the car but also for the track - although that corner is probably the most dangerous on this track.


## Bernhard Langer wins US Senior Open for record-breaking 46th PGA Tour Champions title

For Bernhard Langer, age is just a number. So too, is 46. One month shy of his 66th birthday, the German won the US Senior Open on Sunday to clinch an unprecedented 46th victory on the PGA Tour Champions. Langer carded seven-under overall at a punishing SentryWorld course in Stevens Point, Wisconsin, to finish two strokes ahead of local hero Steve Stricker and overtake American Hale Irwin as the winningest golfer on the senior tour, eligible for players over the age of 50. Irwin's record had stood for 16 years but was sent tumbling alongside a host of others in the German's wake Sunday. A 12-time senior major champion at 65-years-old, Langer put more distance between himself and Irwin (7) in career senior major titles, while simultaneously breaking his own record as the oldest winner on the PGA Tour Champions for the fifth time. And he's not done yet. "I have my mother that's going to be eight triumphs ahead.



100 on August 4th, so I think I have good genes," Langer told reporters. "Hopefully, I'll be around a few more years." Dominance on the PGA Tour Champions has continued an illustrious career for the former world No. 1 and a two-time Masters champion in 1985 and 1993. He won three times on the PGA Tour, but it was his dominance on the European Tour (now the DP World Tour) that foreshadowed his supremacy on the senior circuit. With 42 wins over a 23-year stretch, Langer trails only Seve Ballesteros for all-time European Tour wins, with the legendary Spaniard

The China Meteorological Administration said typhoon Talim, the fourth typhoon of the year, made landfall on the coast of Guangdong province at around 10:20 pm (1420 GMT), bearing maximum winds of 136.8 kilometers (85 miles) per hour. Storm surges and lashing rains also hammered the southern coastline from

#### UK inks deal to join 'anti-China' trade bloc

LONDON (Agencies): The UK has formally signed an accession protocol to join major Indo-Pacific trading bloc the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP). The treaty was inked on Sunday by UK Business and Trade Secretary Kemi Badenoch in Auckland, New Zealand, following 21 months of talks on British membership. The agreement is now set to be inspected by the UK Parliament and existing CPTPP members, and could come into force in the second half of next year, according to reports. Speaking to Sky News following the signing of the treaty, Badenoch described the deal as the biggest trade agreement for the UK since Brexit and proof that the nation is "looking outwards towards the world." "We have a seat at the table in the fastest-growing region, countries are queuing up [to join]... I'm really excited that we've brought home the biggest trade deal since we left the European Union," she stated. Badenoch said the deal would "open up huge opportunities and unparalleled access to a market of over 500 million people." The 11-member CPTPP includes Canada, Mexico, Japan, Australia, Vietnam, Singapore, and Malaysia, among others, and the bloc's total GDP following the UK's accession is estimated at \$15.7 trillion. However, some analysts argue that the agreement is largely "cosmetic" for the UK, which itself estimates that the CPTPP is worth just 0.08% of its GDP. "Ministers also need to set out how this will help the economy and what support will be given to businesses to access any export opportunities," the UK shadow secretary of state for international trade, Nick Thomas-Symonds, told Sky News. The CPTPP grew from the now-defunct Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), which was created by the US to counter Beijing's influence in the Indo-Pacific region.

### Taiwan Not A Country; US Makes Another U-Turn As **Tensions Simmer** Between Taipei & Beijing

WASHINGTON (Agencies): The US State Department suddenly dropped the word 'country' from its travel advisory notice for Taiwan when China's aggression against Taiwan became the major driver of tensions with the People's Republic of China (PRC). The website now features a "Taiwan international travel information" page instead of the "country information page" for Taiwan that the travel advisory previously pointed users to. ## Moscow Reports Ukrainian Terrorist Attack on Crimean Bridge

announced that the Crimean Bridge was the target of a terrorist drone attack conducted by Ukraine, according to the National Antiterrorist Committee (NAK). The attack took place at approximately 3 am local time and involved two unmanned sea vehicles, causing damage to the road section of the bridge. Tragically, two adults lost their lives, and one child was injured in the incident, as confirmed by the NAK. Law enforcement agencies are currently investigating the matter. Media outlets have reported that a section of the Crimean Bridge has been destroyed, and another part sustained damage during what is being referred to as an "emergency" event. Russia's Ministry of Transport has acknowledged that the road surface on one of the tracks has been affected, but it has refuted claims of more exten-

Various photos and videos shared by Telegram channels Baza and Mash depict significant damage to the crucial link connecting the Crimean Peninsula to mainland Russia, with one span noticeably lower than the others. As a result of the incident, traffic on the Crimean Bridge was temporarily halted, with the Crimean Governor, Sergey Aksyonov, declaring an unspecified emergency. It has been reported that a married couple from the Belgorod region lost their lives, and their daughter was injured. The injured child has been admitted to a hospital and is currently receiving intensive care, according to RIA Novosti. While Ukraine has not confirmed its involvement in the incident, Kiev officials have expressed approval.

## 'Mysterious Disease' Triggers Health Checks on Flights from Egypt

plemented stricter health checks for individuals arriving from Egypt, following reports of an outbreak of an unidentified illness in the traditionally popular tourist destination. The Russian health watchdog, Rospotrebnadzor, announced the measures on Monday. Egypt's Ministry of Health and Population reported around 250 cases of the illness in the Qena governorate, located in Upper Egypt. All patients exhibited mild to moderate symptoms, and none required hospitalization. The disease does not appear to have a consistent pattern, although most affected individuals reportedly experienced symptoms such as fever, joint pains, and fatigue lasting between three to five days. The ministry did not provide a specific diagnosis but noted that the symptoms are common to various illnesses, including

Moscow (Agencies): Russia has im- the common cold, flu, and gastroenteritis. Rospotrebnadzor stated that it is collaborating with Egyptian authorities to assess the situation and suggested that the disease may be Dengue fever, a mosquito-borne viral disease commonly found in tropical regions. While Dengue typically causes mild illness, it can sometimes progress to more severe forms, such as hemorrhagic fever and shock. Russian tourists planning to visit Egypt have been advised to take additional precautions. However, the health watchdog did not issue a travel advisory against visiting the country entirely. "To prevent infectious and parasitic diseases transmitted by insects, it is necessary to take precautions, such as wearing clothing that covers the skin, using insect repellents and insecticides, and keeping doors and windows closed while indoors," stated Rospotrebnadzor.

### US President Biden invites Israel Prime Minister to Washington

WASHINGTON (Agencies): US President Joe Biden has invited Israeli Prime Minister, Benjamin Netanyahu, to Washington for an official visit, a statement from the Prime Minister's office said on Monday, Reuters reports. The move marks a shift in US - Israeli relations as most Israeli prime ministers had already received an invitation to the White House this far into their terms. The two leaders shared a "long and warm" conversation, the Israeli statement said, focused on curbing threats from Iran and its proxies and strengthening the alliance between the two countries. Netanyahu told the US President he would try to form a "broad public consensus" on controversial legislation in Israel that would see its highest court stripped of much of its powers.

#### Attacks and displacement spread in Sudan Darfur

Khartoum (Agencies): The paramilitary force battling the Army in Sudan has taken control of a town in South Darfur, triggering clashes, looting and a new wave of displacement, conflict monitors and a witness said on Monday, Reuters reports. Clashes between the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) and the Army around the town of Kas had caused up to 5,000 households to flee, some of them from camps for displaced people, according to a tracking system run by the International Organisation for Migration. The war that erupted between the Army and the RSF in the capital, Khartoum, has led to a surge of ethnically-charged violence and displacement in Darfur, the RSF's powerbase and a region already suffering from long-running conflict.
